Conditions of Sale

- 1) This is a public auction sale conducted by Mumbai based licensed auctioneer, **Rajgor's Auctions of NGS of India Pvt. Ltd.** (hereinafter referred to as "Auctioneer"). Bidding in this Auction constitutes acceptance by you (the "Bidder") of all the conditions of sale stated herein. Bidders may include consignors who may bid and purchase lots in the Auction consigned by the consignor or by other consignors pursuant to their consignment agreement. The Auctioneer reserves the right to include in any auction sale its own material. Bidder acknowledges and agrees that the Auctioneer may not be required to pay a Buyer's Premium, or other charges that other Bidders may be required to pay and may have access to information concerning the lots that is not otherwise available to the public. Any claimed conflict of interest or claimed competitive advantage resulting there from is expressly waived by all participants in the Auction. The Buyer is the Bidder who makes the highest bid accepted by the Auctioneer, and includes the principal of any Bidder acting as an agent. In the event of any dispute regarding the Bidders, the Auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute or may re-sell the disputed lot.
- 2) The Rajgor's Auctions reserve the right to postpone or cancel the auction without notice in its sole discretion. Any lot/s may be withdrawn by Auctioneer without notice prior to its being opened for bidding. The Auctioneer or Consignor shall not be liable for any costs or damages arising from either the withdrawal of material at the auction or the delay or cancellation of the auction.
- 3) The Auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to divide any lot, to combine any lots, or to withdraw lots from the sale without giving any reasons. The bidding shall be regulated at the absolute discretion of the Auctioneer who shall have the right to refuse any bid/s.
- 4) The **estimate figures** for each lot are the Auctioneer's estimation of an expected price only. These estimates are not representative of a reserve price and are published only as a guide to buyers. - 8) Only a **registered member** is allowed to bid in the auction. Each auction requires a new registration. - 10) Auctioneer shall make maximum efforts to properly enter and execute bids received by E-mail, Fax or by other means. However, Auctioneer shall not be liable for any errors for incorrectly entered or incorrectly executed bids. Bidders are responsible for their bids including any errors they may make in placing bids. Auctioneer reserve the right to refuse and reject unsigned bid sheet.
- 11) Lots are sold as shown with all faults, imperfections and errors of description. Neither the Auctioneer nor the seller shall give warranty to any buyer in respect of any lot, or be liable for any fault or error of description. All statements as to the items sold, whether made in catalogues, during the course of the auction, or otherwise are statements of opinion only, and are not and shall not be taken to be statements or representations of fact. The Auctioneer reserves the right in forming his opinion, to consult and rely upon any expert or authority considered by him reliable. Notwithstanding the forgoing, if any lot should have been wrongly described in any material aspect, the buyer may reject the same, provided that he shall have given **notice of intention** to do so and shall have returned the same to the Auctioneer **within seven (7) days** from the day of the sale. Under no circumstances will the Auctioneer be liable for any costs, expenses or damages incurred by the buyer in respect of any lot, including, but not limited to, loss of any kind of profit whatsoever.
- 12) Bidders are advised to **scrutinize the lots they bid for**. Buyers must satisfy themselves as to the accuracy of their purchases at the time of delivery. The Auctioneer cannot be held responsible for any discrepancy which might be discovered after the lots have been **removed from their original packing**.

- 14) **Delivery is against payment in full**. Delivery of the items may be made on the following day after receiving full payment of the purchase price.
- 15) The Purchase price shall be the sum of winning bid and a buyer's premium of **10% plus applicable taxes**, has to be paid by the purchaser. - 19) By bidding in the auction, the Bidder enters in a **legal contract** and accepts to honour all his/her successful bids within 7 days of the receipt of his invoice. By making a bid the buyer acknowledges **his/her acceptance** of these conditions of sale and shall be bound by them. These Conditions shall take effect and be construed in accordance with Indian law and are subject to Mumbai Jurisdiction.
- 20) The auction is conducted in **Indian Rupees**.
- 21) Subject to transfer of ownership along with registration of antiquities in accordance with the provisions of the Antiquities and Art Treasure Act, 1972 and rules made thereafter, all lots of antiquities will be shipped out in an "as is" condition meaning that the item is sold with all existing faults and imperfections.
- 22) The Bidders are required to provide all invoicing details to the Rajgor's Auctions prior to the sale at the time of registering.
- 23) The price estimates do not include any packing, shipping, handling or insurance charges, all of which will be borne by the buyer. The exact amount of shipping-handling and insurance will be conveyed when the final invoice is prepared.

- 26) Buyers may choose to collect their purchases from the Rajgor's Auctions office in Mumbai after the transfer is completed.
- 27) The buyer shall ensure that all payment formalities are completed within 7 working days of the receipt of the invoice. In case payment is not received within such period, this shall be treated as a breach of contract and the Rajgor's Auctions may take any steps, including the institution of legal proceedings, which are appropriate to enforce payment by the buyer. - 1 **Swastika Coin**, Jhabua State, Gopal Singh (AD 1840-1895), Copper, 10.80 g, Swastika within segmented circle on obv, stylized oval leaf on rev, ND (Unpublished, similar to KM# 18.1). *Very Fine, Rare.*

- 2 **Punch-marked Coins, Surashtra Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, 0.9 g, 1/4 Karshapana, **Shrivatsa** symbol, single-composite symbol type, uniface with minor traces of earlier symbol on rev. *Extremely Fine for the type, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,500



- 3 **Punch-marked Coins, Surashtra Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, 0.9 g, 1/4 Karshapana, **Lotus** symbol, single-composite symbol type, traces of earlier symbol on rev. *Extremely Fine for the type, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,500



- 4 **Punch-marked Coins, Surashtra Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, 0.9 g, 1/4 Karshapana, **Elephant** symbol, single-composite symbol type with an elephant walking to right and ancillary symbols around, traces of earlier symbol on rev. *Extremely Fine for the type, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,500



- 5 **Punch-marked coins, Magadha Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, **Karshapana**, five symbol series, First Series of the I-IX-A type but the fifth symbol is not listed and published earlier. The fifth symbol is made of a design tree and seen punched at the centre near the edge (G&H# 78-81). *Very Fine+, Unpublished type, Rare.*

- 6 **Punch-marked coins, Magadha Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, **Karshapana**, five symbol series, First Series of the I-XII-A type but the fifth symbol is not listed and unpublished, being a Chakra and a solid dot inside (G&H# 90-94). *Very Fine+, Unpublished type and Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,500-3,500



- 7 **Punch-marked coins, Magadha Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, **Karshapana**, five symbol series, First Series of the I-XXI-A-1 type (G&H# 148). *Extremely Fine, Rare in this condition.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-2,500



- 8 **Punch-marked coins, Post-Mauryas**, 1st century BC, Silver, **Karshapana, Ram-Lakshman-Sita type**, 5 + 1 symbols, a peacock, a scale and a single punch with 3 human figures with the right one looking like a female, the sixth punch of a peacock on a hill on rev (Gupta & Hardaker# 590). The Punch-marked coins are being studied for iconography and a close study at the Post-Mauryan period reveals that they do follow certain Hindu iconography. The present coin shows the three human figures that can be identified, from left to right, Lakshman, Rama and Sita. Probably these coins are the earliest evidences where we find icons of the three Ramayana deities. *About Extremely Fine, Rare.*

- 9 **Indo-Greeks, Apollodotus II** (1st century BC), Silver, **Drachma**, bust of the ruler to right and Greek legend around on obv, Greek Goddess to left holding a shield and hurling a thunder with Kharoshthi legend around on rev. *Very Fine, uncleaned with patina, Scarce. 3 coins*

Estimate: ₹ 2,500-3,000

- 10 **Kunindas, Amoghbbhuti** (1st century BC), Silver, 2.26 g, **Dramma**, Goddess Lakshmi and a deer in the centre and Brahmi legend around on obv, Hill, Standard and a Swastika in the centre and Kharoshthi legend on rev. *Extremely Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 3,800-4,500

- 11 **Ujjayini** (2nd century BC), Copper, assorted lot of 12 coins of numerous types, varieties and weights. *Very Fine, Scarce. 21 coins*

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-3,000



- 12 **Pre-Satavahanas of Maharashtra** (1st century BC), Copper, 6.34 g, single-punch type with a Shrivatsa symbol signifying the Goddess Lakshmi on obv in a square punch on obv. *Unifaced, anonymous. About Extremely Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,500-3,000



- 13 **Satavahanas, Satakarni I** (1st century AD), Lead, 19.18 g, **Gaja-Lakshmi type**, Goddess Lakshmi, the Goddess of Wealth and Money, is shown standing and facing front on a lotus, is surmounted by two elephants (*Gaja*) who are anointing her with sacred water from their trunks and pouring from a small vessel called *Lota*. Both the elephants are also normally shown standing on their respective lotuses. The rev shows a tree in railing. *Very Fine for the type, Very Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 10,000-15,000



- 14 **Satavahanas, Satakarni I**, Lead, 9.95 g, a lion jumping to right with complete Brahmi legend around, *Rajno Siri Sa / takanisa* on obv, a tree in railing on rev. *Very Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,500-3,000



- 15 **Satavahanas, Satakarni I**, Lead, 14.60 g, a bull walking to right and traces of Brahmi letters around on obv, a tree in railing in the centre, a Swastika on bottom-left and a Shrivatsa on the bottom-right of the tree and ancillary symbols around on rev. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 3,000-5,000

- 16 **Satavahanas**, Copper, 2.67 g, multi-Ujjayini symbol motif on obv with a big taurine symbol, ten-arched hill on rev. *Extremely Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,200-2,500

- 17 **Satavahanas, Satakarni I**, Lead, 3.80 g, a lion seated front and facing on obv, a tree in railing in the left field, an Ujjayini symbol on the right and a Swastika in the bottom on rev. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,500-2,000



- 18 **Western Kshatrapas, Nahapana** (1st century BC), Copper, 2.91 g, anonymous, a thunder-bolt on right and an arrow on left in the centre on obv, a Satavahana-style tree-in-railing on rev. *Very Fine+, Scarce.*

Nahapana was an ambitious ruler of western India and started his small kingdom from Bharuch (Broach) in South Gujarat. He expanded his empire and covered the whole of Gujarat, Malwa, and southern Rajasthan and reached till Nasik, Pune and Junnar in Maharashtra. The present coin is one such coin he issued imitating the then current Satavahana coins after defeating the local Satavahana rulers.

- 19 **Western Kshatrapas, Kshaharatas, Nahapana**, Silver, 2.14 g, **Dramma**, Portrait type with Greek legend around on obv, thunder-bolt and arrow in the centre and legends in Brahmi and in Kharoshthi on rev. Broad flan with die-shift on obv, *Extremely Fine+, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,500



- 20 **Western Kshatrapas, Silver, Jivadaman** as Mahakshatrapa; **Rudrasimha I** as Mahakshatrapa with date Saka 111; and **Rudrasena III** as Mahakshatrapa (3). *Very Fine to About Extremely Fine, Rare. 3 coins*

Estimate: ₹ 4,000-6,000

- 21 **Western Kshatrapas, Silver, Dramma Lakhi**, portrait of the ruler to right on obv, Lakhi (brockage) of the Portrait, incused on rev. Certified by NGS as **VF 25 Lakhi, Scarce.**

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,500



- 22 **Kushanas, Wima Kadphises**, Copper, 3.90 g, king performing *Yajna* on obv with legend around; God Shiva standing facing front and supported by his divine vehicle Nandi Bull to right on rev with Kharoshthi legend. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,500-3,000



- 23 **Kushanas, Wima Takto alias Soter Megas** (2nd century AD), Copper, 7.63 g, portrait on obv and horseman on rev with Greek legend around. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,500-2,000



- 24 **Yaudheya Republic**, 4th century AD, **Complete set of 3 types**, Copper, Drama, God Kartikeya, the Lord of War according to the Hindu mythology standing facing front with a spear in his right hand and the left resting on his waist, a peacock, his vehicle near his left feet, and Brahmi legend *yaudheya ganasa jaya*, = hail the Yaudheya Republic, on obv; three varieties of rev type: **Devasena**, the wife of Kartikeya is standing to left with her right hand raised in the air and the left resting on her waist, the three types include a conch-shell in the left field below her right hand; a *Kalasa* or *Purna Kumbha*, and empty field below her right hand. *Very Fine+ to About Extremely Fine, Rare as a set of 3*

Estimate: ₹ 3,000-3,500



- 25 **Vishnukundin** (7th century AD), Copper, 6.79 g, a conch shell (*shankha*) in an ornate border and in between two tridents on obv, a bull walking to right with Brahmi letters, *shri Ram* above its back on rev. *Very Fine+, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-2,500

Hindu Coins of Medieval India (AD 700 to 1600)



- 26 **Pallavas of Sendamangalam** (AD 1221-1278), Copper, **Kasu**, a bull standing to right with a crescent at top and a Conch Shell in front on obv, king standing to right on rev (Mitch# 355). *Very Fine+, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,200



- 27 **Vijayanagara Empire, Sangam Dynasty, Devaraya II** (AD 1423-1446), Gold, 0.85 g, **Double Fanam**, an elephant walking to left and a sun and a crescent at top on obv, Nagari legend *Shri De / varaya* on rev (Giri# 107). *Extremely Fine, Very Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 7,000-10,000



- 28 **Vijayanagara Empire, Tuluva Dynasty, Krishnadevaraya** (AD 1509-1530), Gold, 1.71 g, ½ **Pagoda**, Lord Krishna as a child seated facing front, and left leg raised from the knee and holding a *Laddu* (sweet ball) in his left hand on obv, shallow Nagari legend on rev reading, *Shri / Krishna ra / ya* (Giri# 161). *About Extremely Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 8,500-9,500

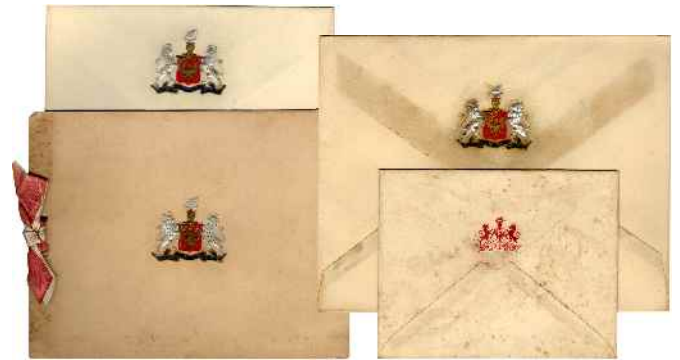

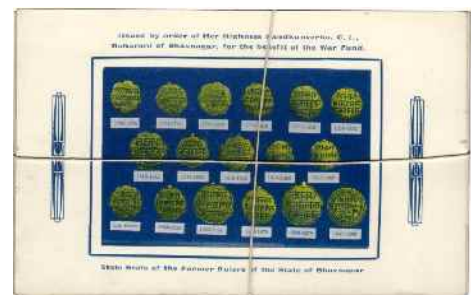

Error Notes

Error notes as a general rule do not come out of the government printing presses but as a human error such notes turn out in the circulation. The holder of such notes are scared because these notes are not accepted by local people and they find it impossible to put it back in the circulation, unless you give it to some cab driver in the dark of the night. However, a collector of coin and note will be delighted to acquire such a note for his collection.

364 **500 Rupees Error note**, unsigned and unprinted on front side but the serial numbers are printed at their regular places in red ink. The first layer of the printing of the basic geometric designs and water-mark panels are printed but the second layer of printing was missed out and later numbered and put in to circulation by mistake. *Very Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-2,500

365 **100 Rupees Error note**, signed by **Y V Reddy**, undated, without Inset, Prefix 9LG. The front of the note is usual but the back side of the note is smudged with overprinting in negative of the front side of Mahtma Gandhi on the back side resulting in dual impressions of both the sides. Found in day to day circulation and collected by a note enthusiast for its novelty, *Scarce.*

366 **100 Rupees Error note**, signed by **Bimal Jalan, Inset L**, Prefix 8MF, without year of issue. Moreover, the note came to circulation in a pack of 100 notes with the loose part of that corner having colour codes for printing. The first finder of the note must have been horrified in getting this note as he must have thought of a loss of 10 Rupees! *Almost UNC, Scarce.*

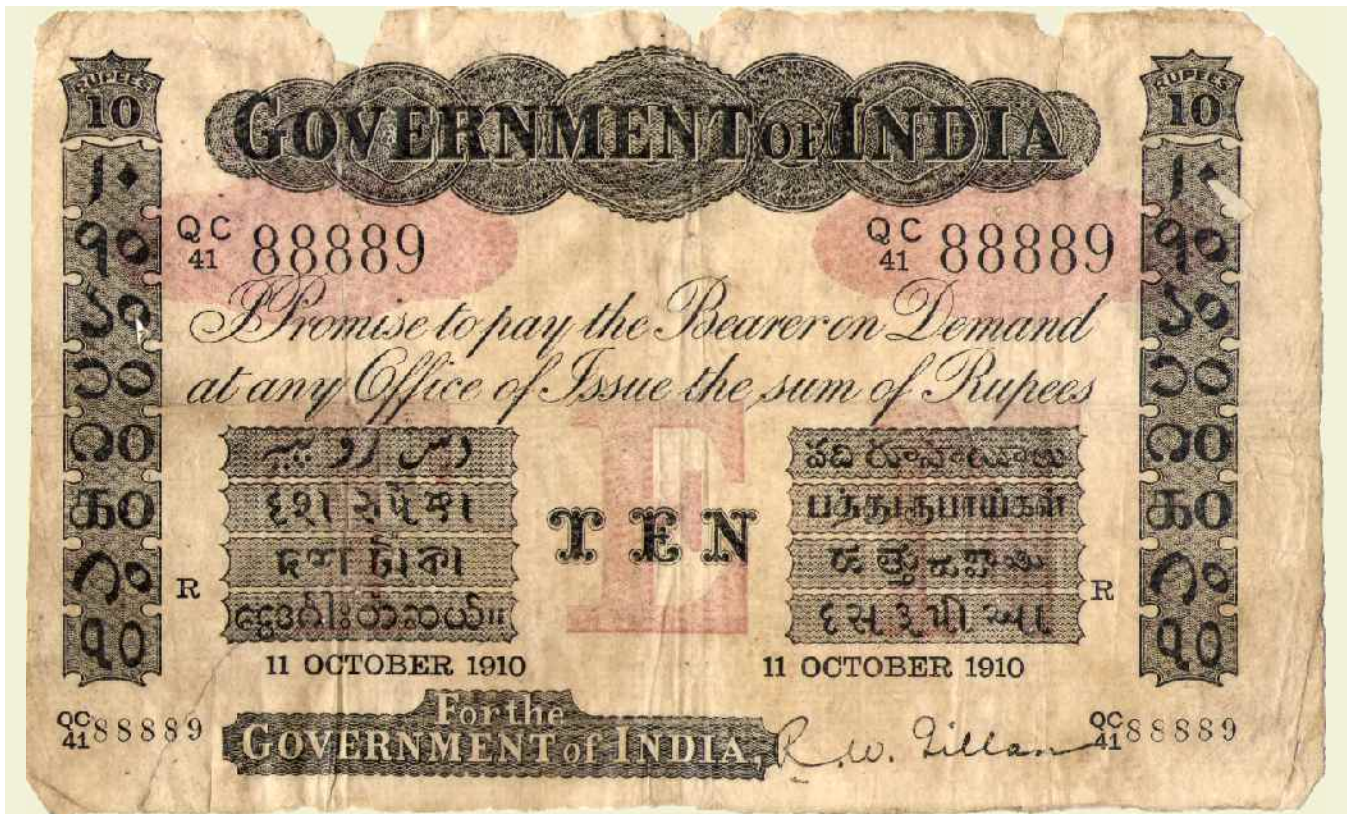

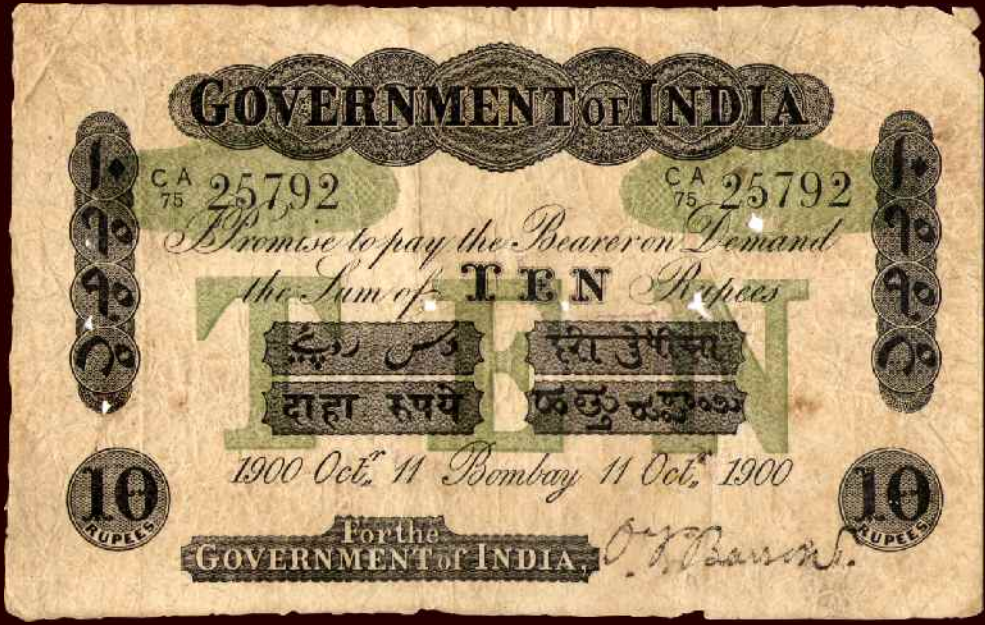
