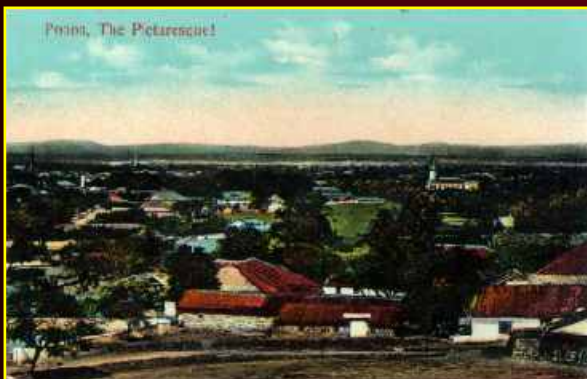

Ancient Coins (600 BC to AD 700)



- 1 **The Swastika Coin, Parat Rajas of Baluchistan, Koziya** (c. AD 235-265), Copper, 3.43 gr, Drachma, Parthian-style crowned bust of the ruler to right with moustache and beaded border around on obverse, a bold Swastika symbol in the centre, Kharoshthi legend around, *Kozanasa Bagavharnaputrasa Paratarajasa* on reverse. First Issue with Kharoshthi legend (Tandon# 38).

Pankaj Tandon has done an extensive research on these little-known coins and brought to light a number of rajas, types and varieties. Refer his article, *The Coins of the Paratarajas: A Synthesis*, in the *Supplement to ONS Journal* 205, 2010, London. *Very Fine+ for the type, patinated, Rare.*

- 2 **Swastika Coin, Ujjayini**, 2nd century BC, Copper, 0.47 g, clock-wise Swastika on obv, a leaf symbol from a tree in railing on rev. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce for being the smallest Swastika coin.*

- 3 **Punch-marked Coins, Magadha Janapada** (6th century BC), Silver, 5.28 g, **Vimshatika**, Four-symbol type with sun and six-armed symbols and a tree in railing and the fourth symbol as a triangle with dots inside. Unifaced. *Repaired, otherwise About Extremely Fine, Rare.*

- 4 **Ayodhya, Vishakhadeva** (2nd century BC), Copper, 3.74 g, **Abhishek or Gaja-Lakshmi** standing and facing front in the centre with elephants standing on pedestal and anointing her on the either side, Brahmi legend at top line reading, Vishakhadevasa (of Vishakhadeva) on obv; a group of symbols arranged in three lines on rev, a Swastika, an Ujjayini symbol, a six-arched hill, a Yupa-like symbol, a kind of *Shri* symbol, a tree in railing and a snake at the bottom line (Allan BMS, pl. XVI-14). *Very Fine for the type, Rare.*

- 5 **Ujjayini**, 2nd century BC, Copper, 2.88 g, die-struck type, a Goddess standing to right, facing a tree in railing and left hand raised above the tree, ancillary symbols around on obv, an Ujjayini symbol with a Swastika in each of the four orbs on rev. Green patina makes the coin a photogenic piece of ancient art, Scarce.

- 6 **City-State of Kaushambi** (2nd century BC), Copper, 1.09 g, inscribed, a horse standing to left with front-right leg raised and an Ujjayini symbol above on obv, Brahmi legend around a central circle, *Kosambi*. *Extremely Fine+, Rare in this grade.*

- 7 **Kaushambi** (2nd century BC), Copper (2), 4.41 & 2.23 g, uninscribed, elephant to left and a Triangle headed standard in front on obv, tree in railing in centre with ancillary symbols around on rev. Cast. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Scarce. 2 coins*

8 **Kaushambi**, Copper, 1.51 g, a bull walking to right with a cross symbol above on obv, a tree in railing with Brahmi legend, *shatamitasa* below. *Very Fine, Rare.*

9 **Kaushambi**, Copper 3.92 g, Double Lanky Bull type, a bull standing to left facing a tree in railing and ancillary symbols including a Swastika above on obv as well as on rev. *Extremely Fine, Rare.*

10 **Traders' Guild Coin - Nigama** (2nd century BC), Copper, 1.29 g, Brahmi legend written in circular fashion, *Nigamaye* (of Nigam). The other side has a motif similar to capital U. *Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

11 **Mathura Monarchs** (2nd century BC), **Jyeshthadutta**, a human figure standing on the left field and Brahmi legend in the right field reads, *jeshthdu...* on obv, a human figure standing to right. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Probably 2nd known coin, Very Rare.*

Hindu Coins of Medieval India (AD 700 to 1600)



12 **Hindu Shahi dynasty of Ohind** (Afghanistan), **Samantadeva**, 10th century AD, Copper, 2.10 g, seated bull to left and early Devanagari legend at top on obv, a roaring lion to right on rev. *About Extremely Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 3,000-4,000



13 NO19-3 **Alupas, Aluvarasa II** (AD 730-760), Gold, 4.69 g, **Boar Gadyana (Pagoda)**, the Chalukya Lanchan (emblem), a majestic male Boar (Varaha as animal and Adivarah as an Incarnation of Vishnu), is shown standing to right with front-right leg bend and raised, the animal is shown as if he is about to eat from the full-blown lotus placed below his mouth, and which has a long stalk. The boar motif is enclosed in a circular dotted border. The outer margin of the coin is lightly struck with inscriptions in at least four areas, the top, centre-right, bottom and centre-left. The legend pockets are inscribed with Telugu-Kanarese letters. Reverse of the coin is interesting with a square box-like map design in the centre with an opening at top, single dots in centre and in all four cardinal directions, and enclosed in a dotted circular border. The margin is inscribed with Telugu-Kanarese legends in at least four pockets in four directions. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Unpublished, Unknown and probably Unique.*

The present coin (and the following lot) is an earliest coin of the Alupas and has been based on the proto-type of Punch-marked coins of their predecessors, the Eastern Chalukyas, especially coins of Vishnuvardhan and Shaktivardhan. The novelty introduced by the Alupas is that instead of Punch-marked technique, they have incorporated all the separate punches into one big punch or a die and struck them on both the sides with the die-striking technique. The depiction of a Boar on their coins suggest that Aluvarasa did acknowledge the supremacy of the Chalukyas of Badami in and around 8th century AD. Another numismatic reason for adopting the Boar motif was the Law of Numismatic Continuity. Great Rarity in south Indian numismatics!

14 **Alupas, Aluvarsa II**, Gold, 4.72 g, the Chalukya Lanchan (emblem), **Boar Gadyana (Pagoda)**, similar to the previous coin but the present coin is now inscribed above the Boar and all circular punch-like legend pockets are now eliminated and thereby introducing their own indigenous type. The majestic boar is standing to right with his mouth shown eating a long stalk of a lotus which is artistically shown encircling him, and around that is a dotted border of beads on obverse. The three letter Telugu-Kanarese legend reads “Chandama” above its back. The reverse is shown with the typical Alupa-emblem of two fishes, shown here with two fishes placed vertically below a Royal Umbrella, above the spread lotus.

Prabhu & Pai (# 1), have published a similar coin but that coin still has traces of the Punch-marked imitation from the Chalukya coins. However, the present coin is different in not having any punch-like symbols, quite like the earlier lot, and has a distinct circle around boar made from the lotus stalk. The reverse is also similar but here again the outer punch inscriptions of Kannasa *Shri* are eliminated from this coin. Hence it appears that the previous coin in this auction is the earliest coin, followed by the coin of Prabhu & Pai and the present coin is the latest in the evolution of Alupa coins. **About Extremely Fine for the type, probably 2nd Known coin! Great Rarity.**

15 **Kadambas of Hangal**, Gold, 4.15 g, **Pagoda**, Lord Hanuman seated facing with head right, left hand resting on the left knee while the right hand raised in *Abhay Mudra*, sacred symbols *chowry* and *shankha* on each side with Nagari legend *Nakara* below on obv; ornamental scroll on rev (Mitch# 229-231). *Extremely Fine, Very Rare.*

16 **Western Gangas** (10th-11th century AD), Gold, 3.74 g, **Elephant or Gajapati Pagoda**, a highly decorated caparisoned elephant to right chewing sugarcane, with portions of a Kannada letter above the elephant's back, a branch under its belly and a branch in front of the trunk on obv; a scroll on rev. (Mitch 193). *UNC, Rare in this grade.*

17 **Western Gangas** (10th-11th century AD), Gold, 3.77 g, **Elephant or Gajapati Pagoda**, a highly decorated caparisoned elephant to right chewing sugarcane, with dotted decorations above the elephant's back, a branch under its belly and a branch in front of the trunk on obv; a scroll on rev. (Mitch 193). *Extremely Fine+, Scarce.*

18 **Western Gangas** (10th-11th century AD), Gold, 3.88 g, **Elephant or Gajapati Pagoda**, a highly decorated caparisoned elephant to right chewing sugarcane, with portions of Kannada letters above the elephant's back, a branch under its belly and a branch in front of the trunk on obv; a scroll on rev. (Mitch 193). *Almost Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

19 **Cholas**, Copper, 2.05 g, an elephant standing to left, facing a spear and an Umbrella and a Shrivatsa symbol on its top on obv, a tiger standing to let in a pouncing position, mouth open, right foot raised, tail raised upward in S-shape, a flag mast in front of the tiger, on the top of the flag mast is a peacock like animal (Krish# 211). *About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare.*

20 **Cholas**, Copper, 2.18 g, an elephant standing to right on obv, a tiger standing to let in a pouncing position, mouth open, right foot raised, tail raised upward in S-shape (Krish# 204). *Very Fine+, Rare.*

21 **Cholas**, Copper, 2.46 g, an elephant standing to right on obv, a tiger standing to let in a pouncing position, mouth open, right foot raised, tail raised upward in S-shape (Krish# 208). *Very Fine+, Rare.*

22 **Cholas**, Copper, 2.70 g, an elephant standing to left on obv, a tiger standing to let in a pouncing position, mouth open, right foot raised, tail raised upward in S-shape (Krish# 206). *Very Fine+, Rare.*

23 **Cholas**, Copper, 0.76 g, an elephant standing to left on obv, a tiger standing to let in a pouncing position, mouth open, right foot raised, tail raised upward in S-shape (Krish# 201). *Very Fine+, Rare.*

24 **Chalukyas of Kalyan, Someshwara IV Chalukya** (1181-1184), Gold, 3.43 g, **Pagoda**, Garuda with a prominent beak flying to right on obv. The form of Garuda on this coin is different from those of the Vijayanagara coins of Bukka Raya and Hari Hara as here Garuda / Hanuman is not holding a sword at his waist. The reverse reads in Kannada, **Dasapa Murari Shri Raja** (the King who scattered Murari). The legend refers to the King (Shri Raja) who destroyed the Kalachuris and restored the Chalukyas, namely Someshwara Chalukya himself, the issuer of this coin (Mitch# 282). *Extremely Fine+, Very Rare.*

25 **Vijayanagara Empire, Hari Hara II**, Gold, 1.69 g, ½ **Pagoda**, Lakshmi-Narayana type with Goddess Lakshmi seated on the left thigh of Lord Vishnu on obv, and Nagari legend **Shri Pra / tapa Hari / hara** on rev. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce in this condition.*

Estimate: ₹ 6,500-7,500



26 **Vijayanagara Empire, Sadashivaraya** (AD 1543-1570), Gold, 3.40 g, **Pagoda**, Lakshmi-Narayana type with the two gods seated facing front on obv, Nagari legend, **Shri / Pratapa sa...** on rev (Giri# 260). *Extremely Fin, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 15,000-18,000

28 **Mahmud of Gazanavi** (AD 998-1030), Silver, 2.59 g, **Sanskrit Dirham, Mahmudpur** (Lahore) Mint, AH 418, Kalima and titles on obv, Sanskrit legend in early Nagari script translates Arabic Kalima as *Avyaktamekam Muhammada Avtaranripati Mahamudasya*, it means, "Allah is One and Invisible and Prophet Muhammad is Incarnation of Allah", with complete marginal legend on rev (Rajgor# 1901; Deyell 66). *Very Fine+*, *Rare*.
A similar lot in the Rajgor's Auction 9, lot 24 was sold for Rs. 16,000.

29 **Akbar**, Silver, **Rupee, Berar mint**, Allahu Akbar type, Ilahi 47, Tir Month, with the name of Coin Die-Engraver, Ram written in Persian below the mint name on rev. *Very Fine, Rare*.

30 **Akbar**, Silver, **Jalalah (Square Rupee), Fathpur mint**, Kalima type, AH 986. Mint name at bottom on rev, deep striking, *About Extremely Fine, Scarce*.

31 **Akbar**, Silver, 1.20 g, **Dasa or 1/10th Jalalah (Rupee)**, Square, **Lahore mint**, Allahu Akbar type with the legend *Allahu / Akbar / Jalejalalhu* on obv, Ilahi 47, Isfandarmuz Month and mint name within dotted square on rev. *Sharp and deep striking, Extremely Fine+*, *Extremely Rare*.

The **Ain i-Akbari**, authored by Abul Fazl contains in its 10th Chapter an elaborate description of the "Coins of the Glorious Empire" of Akbar. In his list of silver coins of Akbar Abul Fazl mentions that silver coins of round shape were called **Rupaya** (Rupee) whereas those of Square Shape were called **Jalalah**. Under the heading of Jalalah (Square Rupees), he mentions 9 denominations which are fractions of square Rupee coins. The 7th item in his list is **Dasa** and is described as **One-Tenth of the Jalalah**. Hence it is clear that all Dasa coins of Akbar were Square and must be called as **Dasa** (pronounced, *Dasaa*) or 1/10th Jalalah. A Great Rarity to appear in such an immaculate condition!

The famous General Hari Singh Nalwa was appointed as the Governor of Kashmir in 1820. He was an efficient but rapacious and therefore highly unpopular Sikh Governor. He governed the province for a little over a year. Some Rupees struck under him, in VS 1878-1879 in Kashmir bear the word *Har* in Gurumukhi script (*Rajgor Auction 2, lot 226*). It is postulated by many that the word *Har*, which primarily means God Shiva, on the Rupees of Hari Singh must be understood as an oblique reference to the name of the Governor Hari Singh himself. However, considering the strong monarchy under the rule of Ranjit Singh, no Governor would ever dare to put his name on the coins of his Master wherein the name of his Master is also not appearing.

The Guru Granth Sahib refers to the Lord as Har and proclaims that:

"Har Har naam Dhi-aa-ay gurbaanee, nit nit chavaa bal raam jee-o" (773-2, 4),

i.e., "I meditate on the Naam, the Name of the Lord, Har, Har. Continuously, continually, I chant the Word of the Guru's Bani."

In another hymn, the Guru announces,

"sahj anand ho-aa vadbhaagee, man Har Har meethaa laa-i-aa." (773-18, 4).

i.e., "By great good fortune, celestial bliss is attained, and the Lord, Har, Har, seems sweet to the mind"

Hence, it is concluded that the word *Har* on these coins do not refer to the Governor Hari Singh Nalwa but is an expression of the Supreme Guru, the Lord Har.
