202 **Punch-marked Coins, Gandhara Janapada** (6th century BC), Silver, 11.12 g, **Bent Bar**, double symbol type, struck from a single punch on the two ends of the coin (Rajgor Series 34, Nos 540-545). *Broad flan, Very Fine+, Rare.*

203 **Punch-marked Coins, Gandhara Janapada** (6th century BC), Silver, 11.22 g, **Bent Bar**, double symbol type, struck from a single punch on the two ends of the coin (Rajgor Series 34, Nos 540-545). *Broad flan with very high curvature, Very Fine+, Rare.*

204 **Punch-marked Coins, Gandhara Janapada** (6th century BC), Silver, 11.3 g, **Bent Bar**, double symbol type, struck from a single punch on the two ends of the coin (Rajgor Series 34, Nos 540-545). *Broad flan with flatten Planchet which is quite unusual for these Bent Bars which are always known in their trade mark curves, Very Fine, Unusual and Rare.*

205 **Punch-marked Coins, Gandhara Janapada** (6th century BC), Silver, 11.2 g, **Bent Bar**, double symbol type, struck from a single punch on the two ends of the coin (Rajgor Series 34, Nos 540-545). *Broad flan but smaller length, Very Fine+, Rare.*

206 **Punch-marked Coins, Kashi Janapada under Kosala Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, 4.26 g, **Vimshatika**, four symbols type with the ABCC pattern of symbols on obv, with the first being the State symbol of the Kashi Janapada, the pair of the Taurine symbol and the fourth symbol a Triskeli (Rajgor Series 58). *Rev has a number of shroff marks, generally identified with the local merchants. Very Fine+, Rare.*

207 **Punch-marked Coins, Kosala Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, 2.63 g, **Karshapana**, Palia Hoard type, four symbols type in ABCD pattern of symbols (Rajgor Series 65). *A number of counter-marks by local shroff on the rev. Very Fine, Scarce.*

208 **Punch-marked Coins, Matsya Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, 4.40 g, **Vimashatika**, AABB pattern of four symbols punched from set of two different punches on the face with geometrical designs similar to the coins of Kosala Janapada with the main State symbol comprising of a dot in circle and Swastika-type 6 tentacles placed in a circular clockwise position, the other symbol consists of a triskeli-like symbol. *Minute shroff marks on rev. Scyphate, Very Fine+, Very Rare and not listed by Rajgor.*

209 **Punch-marked Coins, Chedi Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, 3.45 g, **Karshapana**, four symbols type with the ABCC pattern with a bull to left, a ploughshare symbol and a pair symbol with a circle and a dot inside, surrounded by six semi-circles each with a dot within. *Unifaced. Unpublished and not listed by Rajgor. Mitchiner lists similar coins with 'candelabra-like' symbol as products from the Son Valley (Shahdol area), whereas Rajgor refers to a hoard in Patna Museum with similar marks but at half the weight of Karshapana weight standard. However, none of them list this type with full weight of a Karshapana coin, which is reported from an unpublished hoard in Madhya Pradesh. Unpublished and Very Rare.*

210 **Punch-marked Coins, Andhra Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, 1.70 g, 1/2 **Karshapana**, four symbols type, with the ABCC pattern. *Shingavaram Hoard type coin with the different set of symbols not listed by Rajgor (Series 1). Almost UNC for the type, Very Rare.*

211 Punch-marked Coins, **Andhra Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, 1.68 g, ½ **Karshapana**, four symbols type, with the ABCC pattern. Shingavaram Hoard type coin with the different set of symbols not listed by Rajgor (Series 1). *UNC for the type, Very Rare.*

212 Punch-marked Coins, **Andhra Janapada** (5th century BC), Silver, 1.71 g, ½ **Karshapana**, four symbols type, with the ABCC pattern. Shingavaram Hoard type coin with the different set of symbols not listed by Rajgor (Series 1). *UNC for the type, Very Rare.*

216 **Punch-marked Coins, Ashmaka Janapada?** (5th century BC), Silver, 1.72 g, ½ **Karshapana**, four symbols type, with the ABCD pattern. Godavari-Krishna Delta region not listed by Rajgor (Series 1; Mitchiner pp. 979-983). *Very Fine for the type, not listed by Rajgor, Very Rare.*

217 Punch-marked Coins, **Ashmaka Janapada?** (5th century BC), Silver, 1.62 g, ½ **Karshapana**, four symbols type, with the ABCD pattern. Godavari-Krishna Delta region not listed by Rajgor (Series 1; Mitchiner pp. 979-983). *UNC for the type, not listed by Rajgor, Very Rare.*

218 Punch-marked Coins, **Ashmaka Janapada?** (5th century BC), Silver, 1.61 g, ½ **Karshapana**, four symbols type, with the ABCD pattern. Godavari-Krishna Delta region not listed by Rajgor (Series 1; Mitchiner pp. 979-983). *Almost UNC for the type, not listed by Rajgor, Very Rare.*

219 **Punch-marked coins, Erikutch Region of Betwa river** in Uttar Pradesh near Jhansi (5th century BC), Silver, 1.75 g, ½ **Karshapana**, four-symbols type in the ABBB system. *Very Fine+, Very Rare.*

The coin has four punches in the ABBB configuration with 1 x three fish with dots and 3 x geometric design or a floral pattern symbolism. The ABBB pattern in Punch-marked coins is not found on of the series throughout India. Mitchiner has listed similar coins (Nos 3743-3756) from Hamirpur district in south-west Uttar Pradesh however, this variety of punch-marked is still not reported.

220 **Punch-marked Coins, Imperial Series of Magadha** (4th century BC), Silver, **Karshapana**, five symbols type of ABCDE pattern (G&G Series III). Minute marks of a wooden plank over which the coin was stamped are visible on the rev. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

221 **Provincial Punch-marked Coins, Malwa Region**, Post Mauryan period (c. 100 BC), Copper, 1.29 g, **Karshapana**, two symbols type with a Sun and a tree in railing, uniface. *Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

222 Provincial Punch-marked Coins, **Malwa Region**, Post Mauryan period (c. 100-50 BC), Copper, 1.29 g, **Karshapana**, Copper (3), 2.54, 1.31 and 0.95 g, five symbols series but degenerating into 4 or 3 symbols type with a single symbol on the rev. *Very Fine, Scarce. 3 coins*

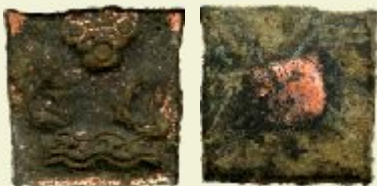
223 **Uninscribed Cast** (2nd century BC), Copper (3), 1.26, 0.82 and 0.63 g, Cast coins with an elephant on obv and tree-river-hollow Cross and a three arched hill symbols on rev. *Very Fine to Extremely Fine, Scarce. 3 coins*

224 **Uninscribed Cast** (2nd century BC), Copper (2), 1.44 & 1.45, Cast coin with an elephant on obv and tree-river-hollow Cross and a three arched hill symbols on rev. The third coin, 1.98 g, is a Magha coin of Kaushambi. *Very Fine to Extremely Fine, Scarce. 3 coins*

225 **Eran** (3rd Century BC), Copper, 10.69 g, Punch-marked type with Four symbols consisting of a river with fishes and turtles at bottom, an elephant to right in the left field, an Ujjayini symbol at top, and a horse in the right field. Unifaced. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare.*

226 **Eran** (3rd Century BC), Copper, 4.39 g, Punch-marked type, with five symbols consisting of a river with fishes and turtles at the bottom, an elephant walking to right on left, an Indra-Dhvaja in a railing at top, a tree in railing in the centre and a Ma-kar Taurine in the right field. Unifaced. *UNC for the type, Rare in this grade.*

227 **Eran** (2nd century BC), Copper, 2.78 g, a bull walking to left and traces of legend at top on obv, four letter Brahma legend on rev. *Extremely Fine, Not reported earlier, Rare.*

228 **Eran region Lajja Pendant** (2nd century BC), Lead, 3.56 g, a women squatting in the front and holding two branches of tree in her both the raised hands, resembling to the famous Lajja Gauri pause of the Goddess of Fertility in western India. *A mount at top for use as a pendant. Extremely Fine, Very Rare.*

229 **Eran region Coin Pendant** (2nd century BC), Copper, 3.90 g, a bull standing to left within a dotted border on obv, unifaced. *A mount at top for use as a pendant. Very Fine+, Rare.*

230 **Ancient Tripuri of Jabalpur** (2nd century BC), Lead, 4.93 g, Uninscribed, a man walking towards an Indra-Dhvaja (Triangle-headed Standard) placed on a railing on obv, a very high relief tortoise in the centre on rev. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Extremely Rare*

Estimate: ` 15,000-20,000.....

231 **Ujjayini** (2nd century BC), Copper, 1.90 g, **Gaja-Lakshmi type** with the Goddess Lakshmi standing on a lotus, facing front, her legs are bend from knees and looks as if she is dancing on the lotus, she is also shown holding long stalks of lotus emanating from the bottom lotus and culminating in the full blown lotus flower on either side of her head. This pause of the two lotuses is a precursor of the later development which ultimately gave the mythology of Gaja-Lakshmi or Abhisheka-Lakshmi wherein the Goddess is attended by two Elephants who are either standing or sitting on their respective lotuses and are anointing the Goddess with sacred water. The rev has an Ujjayini symbol with a dot in each orb. *Very Fine for the type, Rare.*

232 **Ujjayini** (2nd century BC), Copper, 1.45 g, die-struck type of a punch-marked type coin, showing a bull seated to left facing a tree in railing and a river with fishes beneath the animal on obv, traces of off-centre Ujjayini symbol on rev. *Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

Estimate: ` 1,500-2,000.....



233 **Eran** (2nd century BC), Copper (2), 1.93 and 0.64 g, die-struck technique, with all the symbols from their predecessor Punch-marked type but this time all fused in to one big punch called a die on one side of the coin, the reverse being blank. *Very Fine, Scarce. 2 coins*

234 **Kuras of Karwar, Vasithiputra Shiva Kura** (2nd century BC), Lead, 4.81 g, Brahmi legend around bow and arrow on obv, tree in railing and hil symbols on rev. *About Very Fine for the type, Scarce.*

235 **Anandas of Karwar, Mulanand** (1st century BC), Lead, 10.36 g, Brahmi legend around bucket type 7 arched hill, referring to the name as *Rajno Muranandasa* on obv, tree in railing and a Shrivatsa symbol on rev. *Very Fine+, Scarce.*

Estimate: ` 1,200-1,500.....



236 **Kidar Kushana**, base Gold, 7.54 gr, Dinar, king standing to left performing a *Yagna* on obv, Goddess Ardoxo (equivalent to Hindu Goddess Lakshmi) on rev. *Very Fine, Scarce.*

237 **Kota Kushanas** (4th century AD), Copper, 4.42 g, a bull running to left ton obv, Brahmi legend Tako (retrograde for Kota) on rev. *Very Fine+, Error, Scarce.*

238 **Gupta Empire, Samudragupta** (AD 335-380), Gold, 7.37 g, **Standard type without Standard** below Garuda type, king is nimbate and the expression of his face is smart. Staff of the Garuda Standard is not there and Garuda is placed like seating on the right hand of the ruler, Circular legend reads, (*Samarashatavatata*) partly seen in the right field where as clearly readable in the left field, *vijaya jito ripurajito divam jayati* (i.e., the Invincible King who had victories on a hundred battle fields and conquered the enemies, wins the Heaven, in the Upagiti Chhanda). Goddess Lakshmi is seen seated on a throne with lathe-turned legs, wearing a Sari, holding a cornucopia in the left hand and a noose in the other hand, back of the throne visible, Brahmi legend, *Parakramaha* in the right field (Altekar, Class I, variety A, Plate I-14). Altekar has reported a number of varieties of Standard Type but he has listed only 1 coin of this particular variety. Hence the rarity of the coin can be understood with this listing.

239 **Post Guptas of Central India**, Copper, 2.69 g, inscribed Seal of an officer called **Devadutta**, with the Gupta Brahmi legend inscribed in negative reading, *Devadutta* in a rectangle on obv. Traces of two handles for use as a Seal (modern rubber stamp) for official documents. *Extremely Fine, Rare.*

240 **Akaras of Bengal, Swaryakara** (7th century AD), Silver, 7.4 g, a seated bull to left and late Brahmi legend at its top reading *Swaryakaraha* on obv, a bold Shrivatsa symbolizing Goddess Lakshmi on rev. *Very Fine+*, *Very Rare*.

Estimate: ` 8,000-12,000.....



241 **Akaras of Bengal, Bappakara** (7th century AD), Silver, 7.7 g, a seated bull to left and late Brahmi legend at its top reading *Bappkaraha* on obv, a bold Shrivatsa symbolizing Goddess Lakshmi on rev. *Very Fine+*, *Very Rare*.

Estimate: ` 6,000-12,000.....



242 **Akaras of Bengal, Bhutichandra** (7th century AD), Silver, 2.5 g, a seated Nandi Bull to right with legend atop reading partially *Bhutichandrasa* on obv, a Shrivatsa placed within a dotted circle on rev. *Extremely Rare and reported here for the first time, Probably Unique*.

243 **Harikelas of Bengal** (8th century AD), Silver, 0.45 g, **1/16 Unit**, a bull squatting to right and a crescent with a dot at its top and circular borders around on obv, off centre Shrivatsa symbol on rev. *Very Fine+*, *Extremely Rare to find such a small denomination in this series*.

Estimate: ` 6,000-12,000.....



244 **Harikelas of Bengal** (8th century AD), Silver, 1.80 g, **1/4 Unit**, a bull squatting to left and legend Harikela at its top and circular border around on obv, a Shrivatsa symbol on rev. *Very Fine+*, *Extremely Rare to find such a small denomination in this series*.

Estimate: ` 5,000-9,000.....



245 **Harikelas of Bengal** (8th century AD), Silver, 7.1 g, **Unit**, a bull seated with folded legs to left and legend at top reading, Harikela, and everything enclosed within circular borders on obv, a large decorated Shrivatsa on rev. *About Extremely Fine for this delicate series of very thin coins, Rare*.

246 **White Hunas or Hephthalites**, Silver, 3.55 g, Napki Malik type with bust of Napki with winged headdress surmounted by a Bull's head, Pahlvi legend *Napki Malka* in front of the bust on obv; fire-altar with attendants on rev (Mitchiner, ACW# 1502). *Extremely Fine+ for the type, Very Rare*.
