## Ancient Coins (600 BC to AD 700)



- 1 **The Swastika Coin, Satavahanas, Satakarni I** (c. 1<sup>st</sup> century BC), Lead, a Lion seated to left with a long raised tail at the back, a bold Swastika symbol placed above the lion at top, Brahmi legend around on obv. An Ujjayini symbol placed in a square on rev. *Very Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-4,000



- 2 **Ancient Indian Primitive Money** (c. 300-100 BC), a **set of 3 Bull-shaped Beads** from Ujjain (Madhya Pradesh) region. Copper (3), the smallest bead weighs 0.18 g, the medium bead weighs 0.30 g, and the heaviest bead weighs 0.52 g. All the three beads are carved in the shape of a Nandi Bull, the earliest medium of exchange among the primitives in the Barter Trade. The beads are pierced through in the centre of the bull to make them as a bead. *Very Rare* as a group of 3 Bull Beads in three different sizes and weights. The book, *Nishka: the Rigvedic Money* by Prof S K Bhatt is an authentic reference guide for the primitive money that were concurrent with Punch-marked coins in ancient India.

- 3 **Ancient Indian Primitive Money** (c. 300-100 BC), a **Taurine-shaped Bead** from Ujjain (Madhya Pradesh) region. Gold, 0.11 g. Taurine is an English name given to the Nandipada symbol in Indian mythology. Nandipada is basically the shape of a foot of a Nandi. One of the earliest forms of miniature tools in the Barter Trade was the copy of living animals, like cow and bulls. Since actual animals were not feasible to exchange in day-to-day transactions, their miniatures were made in precious and semi-precious metals so that they would serve the purpose as well as be convenient to handle also. As a result such gold beads became popular among the riches and businessmen. The bead has a small mount for threading at the back. *Very Fine, Rare.*

- 4 **Punch-marked Coins, Ayodhya Series** (6<sup>th</sup> century BC), Silver, 6.85 g, Single-composite punch type, a square with the four corners pinched with a dot in each corner, and a solid square in the centre. Minor counter-marks around. Unifaced. *About Extremely Fine, Very Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-4,000



- 5 **Punch-marked Coins, Ayodhya Series** (6<sup>th</sup> century BC), Silver, 6.67 g, Single-composite punch type, a circle made of seven almond-shaped symbols, placed around a solid circle, and a circle as a engulfing border, in the centre with minor counter-marks around. *Unifaced, patinated. About Extremely Fine, Very Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-4,000



- 6 **Punch-marked Coins, Gandhara Janapada** (6<sup>th</sup> century BC), Silver, 11.51 g, 41x11 mm, **Bent Bar**, double symbols punched from a single punch at the two ends of the bar on obv, unifaced (Rajgor Series 34). *Broad flan, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,500-3,000



- 7 **Punch-marked Coins, Gandhara Janapada** (6<sup>th</sup> century BC), Silver, 11.51 g, 25x11 mm, **Bent Bar**, double symbols punched from a single punch at the two ends of the bar on obv, unifaced (Rajgor Series 34). *Broad flan, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,500-3,000



- 8 **Punch-marked Coins, Surashtra Janapada**, 4<sup>th</sup> century BC, Silver, 0.94 g, ¼ **Karshapana**, single-composite Punch type, with a Shrivatsa symbol, representing Goddess Lakshmi in the centre and Triskelis and Taurines around on obv. Unifaced, *un-reused type wherein the coin types were not reused for subsequent stamping of later types of coins. About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

- 9 Punch-marked coins, **Magadha Mahajanapada**, c. 4<sup>th</sup> century BC, Silver (5), 0.150 g each, **Mashaka**. Five different symbols on each of the coins, with a single bold symbol punched on the face, uniface. *Very Fine+*, *Scarce*. 5 coins

Mashaka was a smallest coin in the Punch-marked coins series. Mashaka is said to be the weight of a *Makshika* (House Fly), the lightest in the series. It is recorded in the Arthashastra of Kautilya that a Mashaka was a weekly salary of a laborer during the time of Chandragupta Maurya. Such a small coin could have kept burning the kitchen stove for a full week!!

- 10 **Punch-marked Coins, Vidisha** (3rd century BC), Copper, 5.66 g, 3 Symbols type, three punches comprising of a Triangle-headed Standard (Indra-Dhvaja), an Ujjayini symbol and a Six-armed symbol with three arrows and three Taurines, placed alternately around a central circle. Uninscribed. *The reverse is blank. Extremely Fine for the type with clear symbols, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,500-2,000



- 11 Punch-marked Coins, **Vidisha** (3rd century BC), Copper, 9.96 g, 4 Symbols type with Elephant & Horse. Four symbols type with an Elephant with upraised trunk and walking to right in the left field, an Ujjayini symbol a Dot in each orb and a Taurine placed between two orbs (in the top field); a Horse running to right in the right field; and a River symbol at the bottom of the coin with fish and turtles. The reverse is blank. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare in this weight.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,800-2,200



- 12 Punch-marked Coins, **Vidisha** (3rd century BC), Copper, 12.82 g, 4 Symbols type with Elephant & Horse. Four symbols type with an Elephant with upraised trunk and walking to right in the left field, an Ujjayini symbol a Dot in each orb and a Taurine placed between two orbs (in the top field); a Horse running to right in the right field; and a River symbol at the bottom of the coin with fish and turtles. The reverse is blank and corroded. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare in this heavy weight.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,800-2,500



- 13 Punch-marked Coins, **Vidisha** (3rd century BC), Copper, 3.73 g, 5 Symbols with Taurine-Triangle Headed- Elephant. A Taurine placed in a U-shaped symbol with a connector at the bottom-centre, placed in the left margin; a Six-armed symbol at top; an Elephant walking to left in the right field; a Triangle-headed Standard placed over a rectangle railing and placed in the centre of the coin; and a River symbol at the bottom of the coin. The reverse is blank. *Extremely Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,200-1,800



- 14 Punch-marked Coins, **Vidisha** (3rd century BC), Copper, 7.23 g, 5 Symbols with Ujjayini symbol-Triangle Headed- Elephant. An Ujjayini symbol with a Crescent placed in the left area of the coin, a Six-armed symbol at top, an Elephant to left in the right field, a Triangle-headed Standard in a railing placed in the centre of the coin; and a River symbol at the bottom of the coin. The Ujjayini symbol with a Crescent at top is quite similar to similar Punch-marked coins issued by the Satavahana monarchs with their names. This might suggest a chronological link with those coins. The reverse is blank. *Very Fine, Rare.*

- 15 Punch-marked Coins, **Vidisha** (3rd century BC), Copper, 3.62 g, 5 Symbols with Elephant-Tree-Ujjayini symbol. The 5 punches of the coin has a walking Elephant with upraised trunk and front-left leg, walking to right, placed in the left field, a Triangle-headed Standard in a railing, placed upside to right and at the top of the coin, an Ujjayini symbol in the right field, a Tree-in-railing with 9 boxes in the centre of the coin, and a River symbol at the bottom of the coin. The reverse is blank. *Almost Extremely Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,500-2,000



- 16 Punch-marked Coins, **Vidisha** (3rd century BC), Copper, 4.05 g, 5 Symbols with Lotus-Tree-in-railing-Six-armed symbol. The Ujjayini symbol is replaced with a Six-armed symbol in the right field. The arrangement now is Lotus (on left), Triangle-headed Standard (at top), Six-armed symbol (on right), Tree-in-railing (center), and River symbol (at bottom). The reverse is blank. *Extremely Fine+ for the type, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,200-1,500



- 17 **Eran region, Lajja Gauri Pendant** (2nd century BC), Lead, 3.56 g, a women squatting in the front and holding two branches of tree in her both the raised hands, resembling to the famous Lajja Gauri pause of the Goddess of Fertility in western India. A mount at top for use as a pendant. *Extremely Fine, Very Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-3,000



- 18 **Vidisha** (2<sup>nd</sup> century BC), Copper, 7.83 g, die-struck type, Bull & Nandipada type. A Bull walking to right, facing a Tree-in-railing placed in the lower-right field, an Ujjayini symbol above its head, and a Triangle-headed Standard in the upper-left corner over the back of the bull. Complex Nandipada symbol on reverse but hardly seen on the flan. *Very Fine+, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,500-2,000



- 19 **Ancient Nadner**, Narmada Valley, Ancient Malwa, 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, Copper, 5.82 g, Kamshika, composite punch type with a tree-in-railing on left, a three-arched hill with a crescent at top on right and a Boat-like River symbol at the bottom on obv. Unifaced, with bottom-left corner turned back in the main flan and the third symbol of a boat is over-stamped on the piece. *About Extremely Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 6,000-8,000



- 20 **Ancient Nadner**, Narmada Valley, Ancient Malwa, 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, Copper, 2.89 g, ½ Kamshika, Similar to the previous type but with top two symbols are interchanged in their positions, composite punch type with a tree-in-railing on right, a three-arched hill with a crescent at top on left and a Boat-like River symbol at the bottom on obv. Unifaced. *About Extremely Fine, Very Rare being a half denomination.*

- 21 **Ancient Tripuri** (Jabalpur), 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, Lead, 4.93 g, Uninscribed, a man walking towards an Indra-Dhvaja (Triangle-headed Standard) placed on a railing on obv, a very high relief tortoise in the centre on rev. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Extremely Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 8,000-10,000



- 22 **Ancient Tripuri** (Jabalpur), 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, **Gotamiputra Vishakhadutta** (Vishakhadutta, the son of Mother Gautami), Copper, 6.32 g, a Shrivatsa symbol in the central square and Brahmi legend around on obv, rev is blank. *Very Fine for the type, Rare.*

The ruler and his coin was unpublished till 2008 when Kulkarni published it for the first time in a numismatic souvenir at Indore. This is the only example when we find a ruler named Vishakhadutta is found, otherwise the name only appears in the Sanskrit literature of Kalidas.

- 23 **Mugamukhe City-State**, 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, Lead, 4.34 g, bold Brahmi legend written in the centre, mugamukhe on obv, a frog below a scale on rev. *Patinated, About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare in this condition.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-3,500



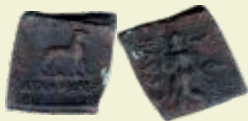
- 24 **Mugamukhe City-State**, 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, Lead, 5.11 g, bold Brahmi legend written in the centre, mugamukhe on obv, a frog below a scale on rev. *Extremely Fine+ for the type, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 3,000-4,000



- 25 **Mugamukhe City-State**, 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, Lead, 8.59 g, bold Brahmi legend written in the centre, mugamukhe on obv, a frog below a scale on rev. *Patinated, About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare in this condition.*

Estimate: ₹ 5,500-6,500



- 26 **Indo-Greeks, Agathocles** (c. 190-180 BC), Copper, 10.79 g, Square, a Lion standing to right with the Greek legend on top and at bottom on obv; a **Hindu Goddess**, probably Lakshmi standing, facing front but the body turned to left, placed in the centre and Brahmi legend on right and left reads, *Rajano Agathokaliyasa* (Boperachchi# Series 10). *Very Fine+, to find an Indian deity and that too with Brahmi legend on the coins of the Greeks is quite a rarity.*

Estimate: ₹ 4,000-6,000



- 27 **Indo-Greeks, Menander I** (c. 155-130 BC), Copper, 19.88 g, Square, facing head of a bull, Greek legend around on obv, Kharoshthi legend around the central motif of Tripod of Greek God Apollodotus on rev (Boperarchchi# Series 29). *About Very Fine, Very Rare for such a heavy weight coin.*

Estimate: ₹ 5,000-7,000

- 28 **Kunindas, Amoghabhuti**, 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, Copper, 11.76 g, six-headed Kartikeya standing with Brahmi legend around on obv, Goddess Shashthi standing on a lotus with large tree symbols on rev. *Very Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,800-2,500



- 29 **Satavahanas, King Satavahana**, c. 1<sup>st</sup> century BC, Copper, 4.29 g, **Junnar Lion type**, a Lion seated to left, facing a Yupa with the tail curled up; standing on a three-arched hill, and Brahmi legend at top reading, *Rajno Siri Sada(vahanasa)*. An Ujjayini symbol in the centre, a square beaded border around on rev. *Extremely Fine, Very Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 6,000-8,000



- 30 **Satavahanas, Satakarni I** (1<sup>st</sup> century BC), Copper, 4.75 g, Punch-marked type, Narmada Valley region of issue, a tree-in-railing at the bottom with fish and turtles; an Elephant to right in the left field; an Ujjayini symbol in the centre; an Indra Dhvaja (a triangle-headed Standard) in the right field; and Brahmi legend from outwards, *Rajno Siri Sataka(nisa)* in the top punch. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 4,500-6,500



- 31 **Satavahanas, Satakarni I** (1<sup>st</sup> century BC), Copper, 7.40 g, an elephant walking to right with the trunk raised, facing a tree-in-railing, a Shrivatsa and a Stupa symbol below its legs; traces of a tree-in-railing as an Under-type in the upper field on obv; Brahmi legend *...jno Siri Sataka...* in the top field, a Chakra with 8 arrows shooting out from the centre, placed below the legend. Issued in Paoni, Vidarbha (Maharashtra) region. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare as a Restruck on earlier type.*

Estimate: ₹ 8,000-10,000





- 32 **Satavahanas, Satakarni I** (1<sup>st</sup> century BC), Copper, 9.28 g, Lion type, a giant lion is shown standing to right with a long tail and facing a tree-in-railing on obv, an Ujjyini symbol in the center with Brahmi legend around reading, *...jno Siri...kana...* on rev. Issued in Achalpur region, Dist. Amravati of Vidarbha (Maharashtra). *Broad flan, About Extremely Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 8,000-10,000



- 33 **Western Kshatrapas, Nahapana** (1<sup>st</sup> century AD), Lead, 5.20 g, **Portrait type, Nashik & North Konkan Region Issue**, typical bust of the king, imitating his silver coins (see next lot), placed in the centre, and Brahmi legend from XII, *Rajno Kshaharatasa Nahapanasa* around on obv. Thunderbolt and arrow, the dynastic motifs of Nahapana on rev. *Very Fine for the type, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 4,000-6,000



- 34 **Western Kshatrapas, Nahapana** (1<sup>st</sup> century AD), Silver, 2.04 g, **Karshapana**, Portrait type, tri-lingual and tri-scriptal issue with Greek on obv, and Brahmi and Kharosthi on rev. Portrait of the ruler to right on obv, thunderbolt and arrow and legends around on rev. *Almost UNC, Rare in this high grade.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-2,000



- 35 **Western Kshatrapas, Rudrasimha I** (2<sup>nd</sup> century AD), Potin, 1.63 g, Bull type, a bull standing to right and corrupt Greek legend at top on obv; a three-arched hill and ancillary symbols in the centre, Brahmi legend around, reading *Rajno Mahakshatrapasa Rudra...* on rev. *Very Fine+, Rare.*

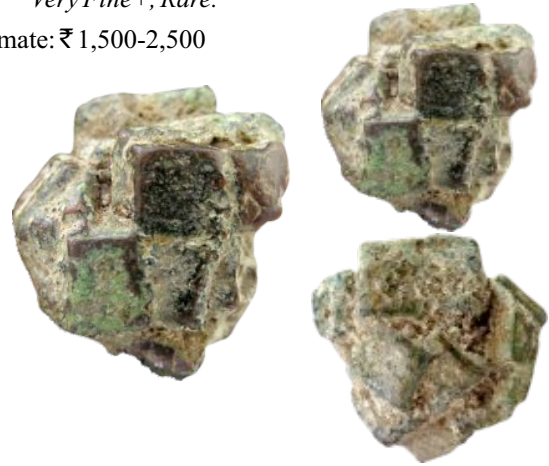
- 36 **Western Kshatrapas, Ishvaradeva**, Silver, **Karshapana**, Portrait type, Year 1 (*Varshe Prathame*), Brahmi legend around three arched hill on rev, as Mahakshatrapa. *Very Fine+, Scarce.*

- 37 **Western Kshatrapas, Anonymous** (3<sup>rd</sup> century AD), Potin, 2.45 g, **Facing Bull type**, a bull standing and facing front with beaded border around on obv, a three-arched hill and ancillary symbols in the centre on rev. *Very Fine+, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,500-2,500



- 38 **Western Kshatrapas, Copper**, 20.36 g, an **Original piece of Treasure** wherein square Kshatrapa coins are joined together by mud, having remained in a river bank for hundreds of years. This is an academic piece of interest for the students of Indian numismatics and history to know how coins remained together for hundreds of years, a found by archaeologists in modern times. *Extremely Rare.*

- 39 **Western Kshatrapas, Rudrasena III** (c. 4<sup>th</sup> century AD), Lead, **Bull type** but anonymous, a Bull standing to right on obv; a three-arched hill motif at top and Brahmi year in numerals at bottom, **Saka 292** (AD 370). *About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,500

- 40 **Western Kshatrapas, Rudrasena III** (c. 4<sup>th</sup> century AD), Lead, **Bull type** but anonymous, a Bull standing to right on obv; a three-arched hill motif at top and Brahmi year in numerals at bottom, **Saka 295** (AD 373). *About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,500



- 41 Western Kshatrapas, **Rudrasimha III** (c. 4<sup>th</sup> century AD), Lead, **Bull type** but anonymous, a Bull standing to right on obv; a six-arched hill motif at top and Brahmi year in numerals at bottom, **Saka Varshe 312** (AD 393). *About Extremely Fine, Rare for the last issues of the dynasty.*

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-3,500



- 42 **Gupta Empire, Kumaragupta I** (AD 414-455), Lead, 3.94 g, **Garuda type**, Garuda, the divine vehicle of Lord Vishnu with outspread wings, facing front on obv, Brahmi legend *Shri Kumaragu(ta)* in the centre and Vaishnavite symbols at top on rev. *About Extremely Fine, Rare in this grade.*

Estimate: ₹ 1,200-2,000



- 43 **Gupta Empire, Skandagupta** (AD 455-485), Lead, 2.71 g, **Garuda type**, Garuda, the divine vehicle of Lord Vishnu with outspread wings, facing front on obv, Brahmi legend (*Shri*) *Skandaguptasya* in the centre and year in Gupta Era reading **Va** (for *Varshe*) **146** (= AD 466) at the bottom just above the beaded border on rev. *Extremely Fine+, Very Rare with full date and in this grade. A similar coin was sold by the Rajgor's for 21,000 (Auction 27, Lot 16).*

Estimate: ₹ 10,000-15,000



- 44 **Yaudheyas**, 4<sup>th</sup> century AD, a **Pair of Terracotta Moulds** for manufacturing copper coins of the Yaudheyas of Lord Kartikeya type on obv, and Goddess Devasena on rev. The mould for the obverse weighs 4.16 g, that of the reverse weighs 3.35 g, and an original copper coin of the type weighs 11.92 g. Bahawalpur came early into contact with the British, the Political Mission under Mountstuart Elphinstone halted at Bahawalpur in December 1808 on its way to Peshawar. **PRESS COMMUNIQUE.**

**KING GEORGE V AND VI RUPEES CALLED IN**

By virtue of a notification issued to-day by the Government of India, Finance Department, King V and VI rupee silver coins and banknotes will cease to be legal tender from May, 1, 1943, although they will be accepted at all Government treasury, post office and railway stations till October 31st, 1943.

Thereafter, and until further notice, they will only be accepted at the office of the Issue Department of the Reserve Bank of India in Bombay, Calcutta and Madras.

This marks the final stage in pursuance of the policy of the Government of India progressively to replace the standard silver coin by the new coin with the square edge in order to minimise the use of silver for ornamental purposes and to check counterfeiting. There are ample stocks of the new coin.

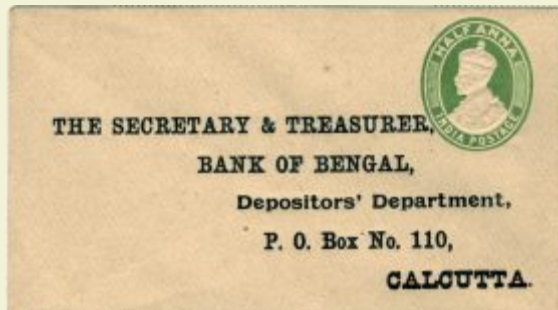
## Conditions of Sale

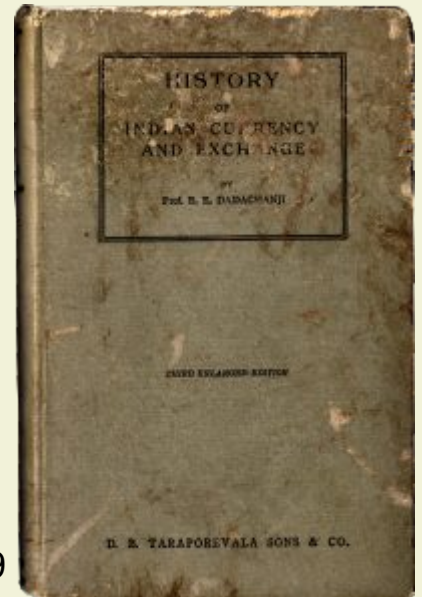

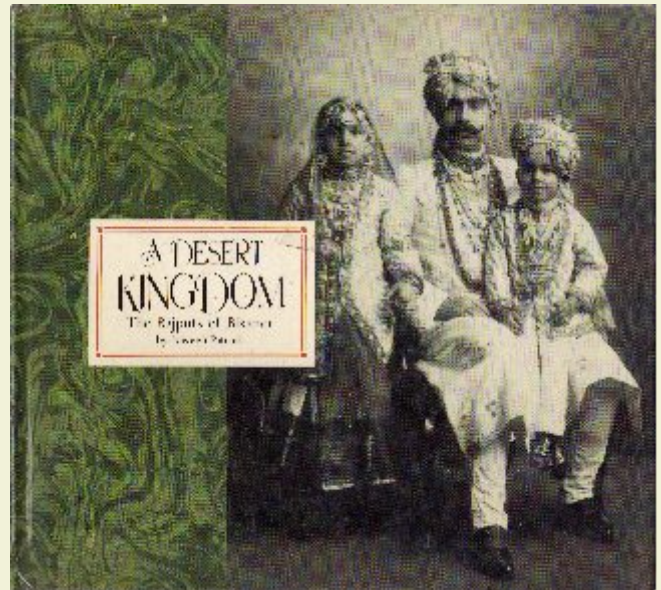
