

### Ancient Coins (600 BC to AD 700)



1 **Lakshmi Seal**, 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, Gold, 0.68 g, a **Shrivatsa** symbol placed in the centre with a crown-like object on its head, the symbol is placed inside a circle on obv, the rev shows two hooks soldered in the centre to be used as a small handle to place the seal and put it on important documents. *Almost mint state, unusual and Rare*.

2 **Kingdom of Macedonia, Alexander III** (336-323 BC), Silver, 15.70 g, **Tetradrachm**, head of young Heracles to right wearing lion's skin on obv., Greek God Zeus holding an eagle in right hand and a scepter in the left hand, sitting to left on a throne, with a Greek Theta symbol as monogram near his knees on rev (Price 3122). *Very Fine+, Rare*.

Indo-Greeks (Greeko-Baktrians), Eukratides I (171-145 BC), Silver, 15.82 g, Tetradrachm, a helmeted and diademed draped bust of the ruler facing to right, he is wearing a helmet adorned with bull's horn and ears on obv. With a dotted border, the Dioskouroi on horses rearing to right with the Greek monogram, signifying a mint to lower right; Greek legend Basilleos Megalou Eukratidou above the horses on rev. (Bop. Series 6E). Broad flan, centrally struck, About Uncirculated for the type, Exceedingly Rare.

A similar coin was sold at a hammer price of Rs. 1,70,000 at Tody auction (2012).

4 **Mugamukhe** City-State, 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC, Lead, 7.77 g, bold Brahmi legend written in the centre, *mugamukhe* on obv, a frog below a scale on rev. *Almost UNC for the type, Rare in this condition*.

Punch-marked Coins, Post-Mauryas, Mathura region, 2nd century BC, Silver, Karshapana, 5 + 1 Symbols, the five symbols on obv consist of a Sun, six-armed symbol, a monk standing on the back of a Bull, representing **Lord Shiva on his Nandi** vehicle, an ornate standard symbol, and a human figure standing to right with left hand raised in air and holding a plough and a staff (*Danda*) in the right hand, depicting **Lord Balaram**, the elder brother of **Lord Krishna**. The 6th symbol shows the same figure of Lord Shiva standing to left but without Nandi Bull.

Depiction of Hindu God Balaram and Krishna was a total novelty in the Punch-marked coins as the belt of Mathura in 2nd century BC was profusely influenced by the worship of Lord Krishna and Balaram, and discovery of hundreds of stone sculptures of these two Heroes of Mahabharata is a proof of this influence. As a natural consequence, the local Punch-marked coins are also influenced by the depiction of Balaram. About UNC, Unpublished, Rare.

6 Punch-marked Coins, **Post-Mauryas**, 1st century BC, Silver, **Karshapana**, 5 + 1 symbols, a peacock, a scale and a single punch with 3 human figures with the right one looking like a female, the sixth punch of a peacock on a hill on rev (Gupta & Hadaker# 590).

Punch-marked coins are being studied for iconography and a close study at the Post-Mauryan period reveals that they do follow certain Hindu iconography. The present coin shows the three human figures who can be identified, from left to right, Lakshman, Rama and Sita. Probably these lots are the earliest evidences where we find icons of Balaram, Shiva and three Ramayana deities. About Extremely Fine, Rare.

7 Punch-marked Coins, Post-Mayuryas, 2nd century BC, Silver, **Karshapana**, 5+1 symbols type, 3 Humans standing type on obv, Series VII of G&H. *About Very Fine, Scarce. 2 coins*

The Imperial Kushanas, Huvishka (c. AD 152-192), Gold, 7.05 g, Dinara, God with Coins type, nimbate king, diademed and crowned half-length bust sitting to left on clouds, holding a mace-scepter in left hand and a filleted spear in the right hand, legend around on obv; Greek God Pharo (Hermes-Mercury), standing left to left, nimbate and wearing winged petasos, he is showing holding in right stretched hand a Money Purse, supposedly filled gold coins, and a filleted scepter is holding in his left hand; tamgha to left, indicating the Mint II (B), 3rd emission, (MK 345/3). Two small holes are filled in, otherwise Very Fine, Extremely Rare.

It appears that Pharo had the same attributes of Hindu Goddess Lakshmi. He is shown holding a purse of coins, referring thereby him as God of Wealth. It is very difficult to find *coins-on-coins theme* in Indian numismatics. A Show-Piece for any Museum!

The Kushanas, Vasudeva (c. AD 192-225), Gold, 7.87 g, Dinar, king standing left, making an offering at an altar with his right hand, and holding a trident in his left hand, a small trident with flaring ribbon attached to it above the Altar, Greek legend *Paonanopao Bazoho Kopano* on obv, Lord Shiva standing facing front and reclining on his *vahana*, Nandi bull, he is holding a trident in left and a noose in right, a tamgha in upper left field with label **Ohpo** (Osho) in the right field on rev (Gobl MK 509; MAC.3389). *About Extremely Fine, Rare.*

10 **Later Kushanas, Ska**, 3rd century AD, base Gold, 7.69 g, **Dinar**, king standing to right with usual Kushana style fire altar and trident and Brahmi legend in the right field near his left hand on obv, Goddess Ardoxo seated on a throne in the centre with a cornucopia in her right hand on rev. *Very Fine, Scarce*.

11 **Western Kshatrapas, Ishvaradutta**, Silver, **Dramma**, As Mahakshatrapa, **Year 1**, **Prathme** (the First Year), portrait type. *Full date on obv and Extremely Fine and Better, Scarce*.

12 The Gupta Empire, Samudragupta (AD 335-380), Gold, 7.51 g, Dinar, King & Queen type, issued to commemorate the memory of his parents. The obv of the coin is shown with the Emperor Chandragupta I standing to left and his Queen Kumaradevi facing him to right, the king is shown an object like a flower offering to the Queen with his right hand, with a crescent (for Chandra or moon) is placed between the two at top, Brahmi legend chandra on the left of the standard held by Chandragupta and Kumaradevi to on the right of the standard; Goddess Durga (Amba) is shown seated on a lion holding cornucopia and pasha with legend Lichhavyah to commemorate the marriage alliance of Chandragupta I with the Lichhavis, the royal dynasty of Nepal (BMC pl.III,-2, similar to the Indian Museum coin, Altekar pl. I-11). Extremely Fine, Extremely Rare.

13 The Gupta Empire, **Samudragupta**, Gold7.48 g, **Dinar**, **Standard type**, the king with a halo around his head, standing left with a short coat, holding a standard (Imperial Scepter) and sacrificing over a fire altar with right hand on obv; a Garuda standard behind altar and near his head, Brahmi legend around; hallowed Goddess Lakshmi seated on throne holding a *pasha* and cornucopia, monogram to left, and legend *Parakramah* written in Brahmi in the right field on rev (Altekar: Plate II no.1). *Very Fine*, *Rare*.

a Empire, **Chandragupta II** (AD 380-414), Gold, 7.85 g, **Dinar**, **Archer type**, king standing to left holding arrow in his right hand and with left hand holding a bow at top, Brahmi legend *Chandra* below his left elbow, Garuda standard behind on obv; Goddess Lakshmi seated facing front on a lotus, holding *pasha* in her right hand and lotus stalk in her left, monogram on left, Brahmi legend *Sri Vikramah* (Altekar Plate V no 4; BMC pl VI-18). *Extremely Fine+*, *Rare*.

15 The Gupta Empire, Chandragupta II (AD 380-414), Gold, 7.91 g, **Dinar, Archer type**, king standing to left holding arrow in his right hand and with left hand holding a bow at top, Brahmi legend *Chandra* below his left elbow, Garuda standard behind on obv; Goddess Lakshmi seated facing front on a lotus, holding *pasha* in her right hand and lotus stalk in her left, monogram on left, Brahmi legend *Sri Vikramah* (Altekar Plate V no 4; BMC pl VI-18). *Almost UNC for the type and Extremely Rare in this grade.*

The Gupta Empire, Chandragupta II, Gold, 7.71 g, **Dinar**, **Horseman type**, the king is riding a prancing horse to right with Brahmi legend in the right and at the bottom margins on obv, the king is holding a sword in his right hand which is placed horizontally above the back of the horse, the king also seems to have a dagger at his waist; Goddess Lakshmi is seated to left on a wicker stool, holding a *pasha* in her right hand and holding a long lotus stalk in her left hand which is going near her shoulder. Brahmi legend in the right field reads, *Ajitavikramaha* on rev. *Very Fine*, *Very Rare*.

17 The Gupta Empire, **Kumaragupta I** (AD 414-455), Gold, 7.47 g, **Dinar, Archer type**, the king standing to left in *tri-bhanga* position wearing a long coat and holding a bow in his left hand and holding an arrow in his right hand, a Garuda-Standard behind his right shoulder and Brahmi legend in the right field on obv; Goddess Lakshmi seated on a lotus cross-legged, holding a lotus with a big stalk and that is coming up near her left shoulder, and a pasha in her right hand, Brahmi legend *shri mahendra*.. in the right field on rev. *Centrally struck and About Extremely Fine, Rare*.

18 **Guptas of Bengal**, Post Gupta period, c. 5th century AD, Gold, 6.69 g, **Dinar**, **King & Queen type**, with the king standing to left holding a battle-axed Standard in his left hand and the right hand is stretched out. Brahmi legend around has been copied from the famous Gupta Sanskrit couplets. The rev shows figures of a King and a Queen, standing to right, the king is holding a dagger while the Queen is supporting her from his back. Brahmi legend in the left field reads, *Shri Jaya*. The whole execution is in dotted border on rev. *Absolute mint state for the weak struck coins of the Bengal Guptas, Great Rarity with this 3rd Known coin!* 

A similar coin of this type is reported to be in the British Museum, and the second coin is in a private collection in Germany. This is the 3rd Known coin of this Extremely Rare type and the first known in India. Absolute Rarity.

19 **Post Guptas of Bengal, Shashankadeva** (AD 600-635), Gold with high percentage, 9.31 g, **Dinar**, Lord Shiva with a halo around his head, seated facing front on his vehicle a recumbent bull which is facing left, Brahmi legend *jayaha* below near the bull's legs on obv; Goddess Lakshmi seated crossed legged on a lotus, facing front, holding a lotus, and with two elephants with their raised trunks on either side of hers, indicating her form as Gaja-Lakshmi or Abhishek Lakshmi; Brahmi legend, *shri shashanka* in the right field of hers on rev (BMC Guptas 607). *A small lump of metal near the edge, otherwise About Extremely Fine, Very Rare with high gold contents*.

### Hindu Coins of Medieval India (AD 700 to 1600)



20 **Indo-Sassanians**, base Gold, 6.96 g, Portrait type with the Sassanian portrait of the Sassanian type facing to right on obv, sacred Fire Altar (**Atash Behram** of the Parsis) placed in the centre with two of their priests as attendants on the either side of the Fire Temple on rev. *Uninscribed, Very Rare*.

21 **Cholas, Raja Raja I**, base Gold, 3.94 g, **Kahavanu**, the king standing to right on obv with Nagari legend *Raja/Raja* below right; king standing to right with a lamp on his left on rev. *Very Fine+*, *Rare.*

22 **Paramaras of Vidarbha, Jagadeva** (c. 12<sup>th</sup> century AD), Gold, 3.7 g, **Pagoda**, four punches of a temple showing a human figure, representing Lord Shiva, *Sri Jagadeva* in Nagari and two punches of a geometrical D-shaped design on obv, Unifaced, punch-marked technique. *Extremely Fine+*, *Scarce*.

Estimate: ₹11,000-13,000



23 Chandellas of Jejakbhukti, Vira Varmadeva (c AD 1261-1286), Gold, 3.82 g, Dinar, Goddess Lakshmi seated on obv, Nagari legend, Srimad Vira Varmanadeva (Deyell p. 95). Very Fine+, Extremely Rare.

No coins of Vir Varmadeva were reported by the monumental work of Deyell, Living Without Silver. Its just recently in last year that a coin of this ruler turned up in market and the present coin is second such coin to appear for an auction.

24 **Eastern Chalukyas**, c. 900-1025, Gold, 4.22 g, **Pagoda**, Punch-marked type with 8 punches in around and ninth punch in the center similar to a boar to left. Unifaced, the 8 punches include Telugu-Kanarese characters referring to the name of ruler. Two tiny holes made for use as a pendant, a small chisel mark for metal testing, otherwise Very Fine+, Unpublished, Unique.

This is totally a new variety in the series of the Eastern Chalukyas with the central symbol of a totally different variety. The coin also has a history as it was worn as a pendent by an Adivasi in the Gadhchiroli's Tribal area. She sold it to a goldsmith who made cut mark to test the metal content. Subsequently it was acquired by a senior collector for his own collection. An interesting piece of history.








26 **Chalukyas of Kalyan**, 10<sup>th</sup> century AD, Gold, 4.34 g, **Pagoda**, anonymous issue with an eight-peteled lotus in the centre with a beautiful dotted circle on obv; *Unifaced with minor counter-marks on rev. Graded by NGS as AMS 50. Extremely Rare.*

27 **Chalukyas of Kalyan**, 10<sup>th</sup> century AD, Gold, 4.41 g, **Pagoda**, anonymous issue with an ornamental square design in the centre with beautiful circle ornamentation in centre on obv; a temple entrance on rev. *Graded by NGS as AMS 58. Extremely Rare*.

Estimate: ₹50,000-55,000





28 **Kadambas of Goa, Sivachitta** (11<sup>th</sup> century AD), Gold, 4.3 g, **Pagoda**, a lion standing left with raised tail on obv, early Nagari legend in five lines across the field citing name and titles of the issuing king on rev. *Some flat areas near the edge, otherwise About Extremely Fine, Rare.*

29 **Western Gangas**, Gold, 3.83 g, **Gajapati Pagoda**, a caparisoned elephant standing to right chewing sugarcane, a branch under its belly on obv, a scroll on rev (Mitch 193). *Very Fine+*, *Rare*.

30 **Western Gangas**, Gold, 3.73 g, **Gajapati Pagoda**, a big caparisoned elephant standing to right chewing sugarcane on obv, a scroll on rev (Mitch 193). *Extremely Fine+*, *Rare*.

31 **Telugu Chodas of Nellore, Bhujabala**, 13th century, Gold, 3.53 g, **Pagoda**, punch-marked type with two Kannada *Shri* punches clearly visible, and a third punch similar to a trident on obv (cf. Mitchiner#313). *Unifaced, Extremely Fine+, Rare.*

In such a case, the discovery of their gold coin in such a good condition and that too with a high percentage of gold contents indicate the issue of this gold coin must have been a ceremonial issue, related with the coronation of the king or like. A discovery with a very high potential for the south Indian numismatics.

Bahman Shah *alias* Hasan Gangu *alias* Zafar Khan was a confederate of Ismail Shah, the first revolter of Deccan against Muhammad III bin Tughlaq. When Muhammad III left for Gujarat, leaving the revolt midway, Zafar Khan took on the army, defeated the Delhi army and took a new name of Bahman Shah and ascended the throne of Gulbarga as the first independent Sultan of Deccan. He traced his lineage back to Persia; moved his capital from Daulatabad to Gulbarga and renamed it as Ahsanabad. Being the first ruler, his gold coins are extremely rare as he was busy in consolidating his empire rather than sitting on an established settled Sultanate. As a result his gold coins were more ceremonial than the regular gold currency.

This fact is also revealed from the number of gold coins known in last half a century, merely about half a dozen or so. This is for the first time a gold coin of this ruler has appeared for auction in any of the Indian auctions. Truly a great rarity!

The name of the New Solar Era founded by Akbar, the Great Mughal Emperor (AD 1556-1605) is popularly known as **Ilàhi Era** but its official name was **Tàrākh-i-Ilàhi**.

Abul Fazl, the author of *Ain-i-Akbari* informs about this new era in his book:

His Majesty had long desired to introduce a new computation of years and months throughout the fair regions of Hindustan in order that perplexity might give place to easiness. He was likewise averse to the era of the Hijira (Flight) which was of ominous signification, but because of the number of shortsighted, ignorant men who believe the currency of the era to be inseparable from religion.

In 992 of the Novilunar year the imperial design was accomplished. Amir Fathullah Shirazi, the representative of ancient Sages, the Paragon of the house of wisdom, set himself to the fulfillment of this object, and taking as his base the recent Gurgàni canon began the era with the Accession of His Imperial Majesty. The years and months are natural Solar without intercalation and the Persian names of the Months and days have been left unchanged. The days of the months are reckoned from 29 to 32 and the two days of the last are called Ruz o Shab.

The list of all the 12 months with their respective days is appended herewith: 1- Farwardin (31), 2- Ardibihisht (31), 3- Khurdàd (32), 4- Tir (31), 5- Amardàd (31), 6- Shahrevar (31), 7- Mihr (30), 8- Abàn (30), 9- Azar (29), 10- Dai (29), 11- Bahman (30), and 12- Isfandàrmuz (30).

#### **Zodiac Coins of Jahangir**





It seems that the Mughal Emperor Jahangir himself was a numismatist and a coin collector. The way he introduced new coins and new types, gives him such a credit and puts him among the top five Monarchs of India. Jahangir introduced, among many new types, a novel type of silver and gold coins called Zodiac Coins. These coins illustrate the actual figure of a Zodiac sign on the face of the coins, and that too in the medieval India wherein the Islamic traditions were followed by books. One such a tradition was in non-portraiture of any living objects, including animals, human beings and gods. At such a crucial time, Jahangir dared to issue coins with figures of live animals and humans on his coins.

A detailed explanation of this event has been given in the *Tuzuk-e Jahangiri* (the daily Diary of the Jahangir) by the Emperor himself. He writes on 23<sup>rd</sup> Farwardin of the 13<sup>th</sup> Regnal year (15<sup>th</sup> Rab'i II, AH 1027=AD 1618) that:

The rule of coinage was that on one face of the metal, they stamped my name, and on the reverse the name of the place, and the month and year of the reign. At this time it entered my mind that in place of the month they should substitute the figure of the constellation which belonged to that month; for instance, in the month of Farwardin, the figure of a ram, and in Urdibihisht the figure of a bull. Similarly, in each month that a coin was struck, the figure of the constellation was to be on one face, as if the Sun was emerging from it. This usage is my own, and has never been practised until now.

Unfortunately, Shah Jahan, the son and successor of Jahangir as well as Aurangzeb, the grand-son of Jahangir, forbid the use of these Zodiac coins, melted them down and even issued Royal Farmans to cut hands of those in possession of these coins. We can imagine that anybody would like to prefer his hands rather than keeping those coins. As a result most of these coins found their fate in melters' pots. Luckily, a few such lucky coins are still available for us to own, possess and admire the beauty of these Zodiac coins which were issued by the direct order of the Emperor himself.

Here we present a few of those forbidden coins for the art lovers of India:

Coins of the Zodiac type of Jahangir became immensely famous even during his life time. The demand for these coins rose more than its supply. The European travelers visiting the Mughal capital were awestruck by these coins and were paying premium for these coins to acquire them. Tavernier in 1678, informs about the Zodiac Rupees the rest two or three of them are so hard to be found, that an hundred crowns has been given for one of them. As a result local shroffs started imitating these Zodiac coins and tried to earn premium from the Europeans. The present coin is one such coin.

However, Azam could not enjoy the fruits of Royal life as he was defeated and killed by his elder half-brother Prince Muazzam on 19<sup>th</sup> June 1707, who later became known as Shah Alam I (*for his rare coins with the name Muazzam, refer forthcoming lots*).

Since Azam was not at Gujarat when he was proclaimed Mughal king, his coins were issued by his loyal men in western India and in Gujarat. Only 3 or 4 coins of the Junagadh mint of Azam Shah are reported till now and they seem to be ceremonial issues when Azam ascended the Mughal throne. Hence the great rarity of this mint.

In the event of any dispute regarding the Bidders, the Auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute or may re-sell the disputed lot.
- 2) The Rajgor's Auctions reserve the right to postpone or cancel the auction without notice in its sole discretion. Any lot/s may be withdrawn by Auctioneer without notice prior to its being opened for bidding. The Auctioneer or Consignor shall not be liable for any costs or damages arising from either the withdrawn of material at the auction or the delay or cancellation of the auction.
