1 Swastika Coin, Ancient Saurashtra (Gujarat), c. 50 BC, Copper, 1.94 g, anonymous, uninscribed, typical Ujjayini-type motifs depicting Lord Mahakaal (the deadly Form of Lord Shiva as a God of Death) holding a staff (*Danda*) and a water-pot (*Kamandalu*), the two signs of Punishment and Water of Life, and a six-armed symbol representing on-going cycle of Life and Death on obv. The rev is depicting one angular Swastika (Svastika) placed in the centre with the end-points having the form of a Taurine symbol, representing like each part of the Swastika has a mouth. Beautiful green patina, Very Fine+.

Punch-marked Coins, Surashtra Janapada (5th century BC), Silver, 0.9 g, ½ Karshapana, Single-symbol type with a big bold Shrivatsa symbol (representing Goddess Lakshmi) in the center with ancillary symbols around on obv. Unifaced and punched once only and not multiple times as seen mostly on these coins and hence the rarity, About Extremely Fine.

An Ujjayini symbol on rev. Monarchical names on the coins of Ujjayini are extremely rare to find and are known by a couple of names of rulers only. To find a complete name like on this coin is further rarity. Extremely Fine+, Rare.

20 Ujjayini (1st century BC), Copper, 3.15 g, a big Taurine or a *Ma-kaar* is counter-marked on the reverse of the standing Mahakal type coin. The reverse of the coin is actually an obv of the original sub-type coin. Very Fine+for the type, Scarce.

23 Satavahanas, Copper, 27.93 g, 36 x 30 x 14 mm, Mukha-Linga, a Cover for a Shiva Linga with a figure protruding from left side, geometric design on the body. Extremely Rare.

Unusual item with an implication on religious history of Maharashtra and India. Rare. Such portable Lingas are reported to be found along with the Satavahanas coins in Maharashtra. The find indicates that such Lingas belonged to rich businessmen of the period who used to travel a lot and carried these for personal worship and were kept in money begs along with coins.

24 Kushanas, Kanishka I, Gold, 7.89 g, Dinar, Nanashao type, King standing to left holding a staff in his left hand and offering to a Fire Altar with his right hand, legend around on obv, Iranian Goddess Nanashao standing to right and a label of her name in the left field behind her on rev. Very Fine+, Very Rare.

Nana or Nanashao is an Iranian Goddess of wealth and is a counter-part of Hindu Goddess Lakshmi. Along with the Kushanas, her worship arrived in Western India and remained till today in Rajasthan, Gujarat and Maharashtra. She is now known by the name of Hingalaj Mata.

25 Western Kshatrapas, Damasena, Potin, anonymous, Elephant type, an elephant standing to right on obv, three arched hill and date below on the rev, Saka 153 (AD 231). Very Fine+, Scarce.

Western Kshatrapas, Bhartrdaman, son of Rudrasena II, Silver, Karshapana, portrait type, as Mahakshatrapa, dated Saka 210 (AD 288). Numerals in the date as figures for 200 and 10 are clearly visible behind the ears of the bust on obv. Dates on these coins of later Kshatrapa rulers are getting rarer as these coins were produced on smaller flans and the date numerals mostly were minted out of the flan as a result we hardly come across full dates on these coins. Very Fine+, Scarce.

Very Fine+, Extremely Rare.

Samachardeva was a post-Gupta King of Bengal and is credited with spread of Buddhism in Eastern India and especially in the Bengal region.

Unifaced, Very Fine+, Rare.

The Triangular Shape arrowhead belongs to the North Eastern Region (Assam, Nagaland, Burma). Interestingly, such types of artifacts are still in use among the ethnic groups of the hilly region in North Eastern India.

Another major use of these tools was as Barter Exchange. These were traded as money among the tribes by their manufactures in exchange of their goods.

49 Arrow Head Money of Assam (16th -17th Century), Iron, 17.11 g, (total Length: 13.5 cm, blade: 9 cm, breadth - 3.3 cm); these Arrow Heads were mostly used for hunting as well as for offensive fighting even during the medieval period. Ethno-archaeological study of these historic weapons indicate that such utility as well as military tools are still employed by a few modern-day ethnic tribes of the North-Eastern region of India.

Porcelain & Stone Art

Bengal was overwhelmed by the introduction of German made porcelain figurines from 1830s to about 1940s. The beautiful statues of European dancers, men, women and children attracted the fancy of Bengali mind and created a huge demand for such German statues but with the Indian themes. As a result, Bengali artists cast dies of figures of Indian mythological figures like Durga, Ganesha, Shiva and many more. These dies were then sent to Dresden in Germany and such Bengali statues were manufactured there. These were bought back by British traders who exported them back to India.

We present here a select collection of such German-made porcelain figurines of numerous themes along with some related porcelain items that were prevalent among the elite Bengali homes. These were used either as Utility Art or as Decorative Art in the homes of the rich and influential Bengalis!






