Ancient Coins (600 BC to AD 700)



303 **The Ganesha Coin, Thailand**, 10 Baht, Bi-metal, portrait of the ruler to left on obv, Lord Ganapati seated in the centre with four hands and holding various *Ayudhas*, value around on rev. *Almost UNC*.

Estimate: ₹500-1,000



304 **Coin Motif Pendant**, 2nd century BC, Gold, 1.74 g, the Coin Motif of four crescents around a central circle is represented here in this ancient locate with a pendant mount at the centre on rev. Such symbols are profusely found on the local Punch-marked coins of Surashtra Janapada, datable to c. 500-300 BC, and also on copper coins of Vidisha refion, dateable to about 250 BC. The present piece of antique jewellery was also found along with silver Surashtra Janapada coins in the Junagadh region of Gujarat. *About Extremely Fine, Rare*.

305 Ancient Bead Money, Ujjain Region (2nd century BC), Agate and other mediums (10), assorted lot of numerous beads of early historic Madhya Pradesh in red agate, black agate, steatite, with plain conical shapes to oval shapes and having a number of decorations like natural white bands over the belly of the black bead, continuous brown band over the ivory bead, and like. *Very Fine to Extremely Fine, Rare as a group of 10 beads*.

Very Fine+, Rare with unusual raised left hand.

315 **Panchala, Bhanumitra** (c AD 100), Copper, 12.26 g, **Karshapana**, a bold central square punch showing three stylized symbols and Brahmi legend *Bhanumitasa* on obv., a railed tree and hill on rev. (similar to Mitchiner# 4549 but tribal variety). *Very Fine, Rare*.

316 **Kushanas, Vasudeva**, Gold, 7.99 g, **Dinar**, the Kushana king standing left, a offering at an altar to left, behind the hand is a garlanded trident, he is holding a trident in his left hand, a **Swastika** (usual, clock-wise) is placed between his legs, and Kushano-Greeko legend around reading, *Paonanopao Bazoho Kopano* (= Shao Nano Shao Kushano) on obv; Lord Shiva nimbate, standing facing front, holding a trident and diadem, His vehicle Nandi Bull standing behind to left, with a tamgha to upper left and legend **Ohpo** (OESHO) in right margin, complete die impression on both sides (Gobl 509; Mitch ACW.3389). *About Extremely Fine, Very Rare*.

317 **Nandi Bull Ring** (2nd century AD), Copper, 7.72 g, 30 x 18 mm, a Nandi Bull seated in its usual position as seen in Shaiva Temples, with a tortoise on its left and a snake on its right, all the three animals associated with the worship of Lord Shiva. The religious Bull ring was discovered in the river bed of Narmada near Omkareshwara in Madhya Pradesh. *Very Fine+*, *Rare*.

318 **Gupta Empure, Narsimhagupta** (AD 518-530), Gold, 9.49 g, **Heavy Dinar, Archer type**, king nimbate standing left, holding a bow and an arrow, legend below his left arm, reading in Gupta Brahmi *Nara*, Garudastandard behind on obv, Goddess Lakshmi nimbate, seated facing on a lotus, holding diadem and lotus, tamgha to left, and a tamgha near the right arm, with legend *Sri Baladityah* in right margin. *About Extremely Fine, Very Rare*.

319 **Post-Gupta Sealing** (6th century AD), Terracotta, 18 mm, Gupta Brahmi legend in the centre in an oval reading, *Jayakula*. *Extremely Fine*, *Rare*.

322 **Chalukyas of Gujarat, Siddhraj Jayasimha**, Silver, 0.44 g, **Hasti Dramma**, an elephant walking to right with a long trunk touching the ground on obv, early Nagari legend reading on rev, *jaya si / piya*. The Nagari script is bold and cruder in nature, indicating a later mintage of the Chalukyas. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce*.

323 **Medieval Gujarat, Rana Hasti**, Silver, 0.42 g, Hasti Dramma, an elephant standing to right with beade border around on obv, Nagari legend *Shri Rana Hasti* on rev. *Broad flan, With nearly complete legends, About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

324 Gahadavalas of Kanauj, Govinda Chandradeva (1114-1154), Gold, 3.96 g, Dinar, Goddess Lakshmi seated on obv; Nagari legend *Srimad Govindchandra Deva* on rev (Deyell# 145). *Very Fine+*, *Scarce*.

325 Hindu Kashmir, Kidarites - Hunnic dynasties, Sri **Tujina I** (7th century AD), Base Gold, 7.21 g, **Dinar**. Lord Shiva as a standing male figure facing to left, with haloed head, wearing crown with two crescents and diadem ties, looped earrings with two jewels, Kushanstyle knee-length overcoat (with arched hem and decorated with jewels (dots) and tied at waist with ribbons hanging from waist to figure's left and ribbons attached to left shoulder) and leggings (decorated by jewels (dots) and tied at ankle), holding trident (with crescent around the prongs) in left hand and drops offering on small altar with right hand. Inscription in upper left field to be read from edge of coin: Sri Tuysina (Tujina) on obv. Goddess Uma - Paravati, the consort of Lord Shiva is shown as a seated female figure frontal, with head turned slightly to right, wearing looped earrings, necklace of jewels (dots), bracelets and anklets, legs crossed, with right foot in front and left foot unseen, wearing dress decorated with jewels on abdomen and flowing over legs, and scarf over shoulders and around upper arms, with scarf ends extended to right and left at waist height, holding lotus with long stem in left hand resting on left foot, with the blossom above her left shoulder, and another lotus in raised right hand above her right shoulder. Throne has a bar across the front with large finals tied with ribbons, partly covered by the end of the figure's dress. Inscription in left field arranged vertically: Kidara; in right field horizontally: Jaya. This coin is related by its design (similarity to issues of Toramana) and its inscription Sri Tujina to the kings of Kashmir as described in the second and third books of Kalhana's Rajatarangini, the Kashmir Chronicle. There are two kings named Tunjina mentioned in these books. The most likely attribution for this coin is to the first of these kings (Rajatarangini II.11-56) who is said to have ruled in Kashmir for 36 year The second Tunjina was also known as Pravarasena (III.97-101) and coins attributable to this king with his name Pravarasena are known, so it is unlikely that he also issued coins with his other name. The chronology of the Rajatarangini is very confused from this period, providing dates in the first century AD according to one system or fourth century AD, according to another. A more likely date for these

kings is in the 7th century, because of the mention of a king Pratapasila (III.330; related to the Indian king Harshavardhana) in association with a king ruling a few years later. The figure on the front could be identified as the king on the analogy of its Kushan prototype or as Lord Siva on account of the trident carried in his left hand. The figure on the reverse appears from the lotus motifs to be Sri, but in the Saivite context of this coin, could be a representation of Siva's consort Uma or Parvati. The design also owes as much to Gupta as to Kushan coin design. *About Extremely Fine, Extremely Rare.*

A similar coin of this ruler was sold by the Rajgor's Auction 3, Lot 34, for 3,51,000.

Lingen & Wiggins in their monumental book, *Coinage of the Sindhias* attribute silver Rupees similar to this coin to Jayappa Sindhia the first Sindhia 'ruler'. However, at this early date, the Sindhias were still secondary courtiers of the Peshwa and as such this coin is more appropriately attributed to the Marathas. By RY 7, Jayappa had already died and the Sindhia domains were in the hands of his son Jankoji Sindhia and brother Dattaji Sindhia. This coin was struck under Maratha rule with Jayappa Sindhia as Governor, he was a Maratha general who ruled in north India from 1745 to 1755. An interesting piece of Maratha History!



In silver coins, the metal went down from 97.5% to 88%, and weight went down from 11.3 g to 10.4 g.

Having a number of complaints of the scarcity of silver coinage, Lord Robert Clive introduced a gold coinage on 30th July 1766, which had Roman letter C imbibed near *Julus* on the rev. The coversion of the gold Mohur was fixed at 14 Sikka Rupees with the sanction of ½, ¼, and 1/8 Mohurs. However, this experiment of ficed Legal tender gold coins failed and they were withdrawn from circulation. Interstingly, at the time of their recall from circulation in Bengal, Madras was at war with Haider Ali of Mysore, and Madras requested aid from Bengal, including supply of money. Calcutta having this withdrawn gold in the treasury, shipped the greater part to Madras who recoined these Mohur coins into then current Star Pagodas.

Before the East India Company standardized uniform currency throughput India in 1835, all the 3 presidencies were trying to regularize their currencies. In Bengal, the EIC tried to merge the mints at Calcutta, Farrukhabad, Banaras and Sagar in to one currency with the same style of Farrukhabad coinage and fixed RY 45, called 45 Sun Sikka. They also tried their hands in copper currency. The very first such attempt was to issue a Rupee-like copper currency of 1 Pice Coins. They did issue some Pattern coins, but on objection of mint masters and experts on the ground that such copper coins will be plated with silver and will be fooled as silver Rupee coins, the production of such Pattern coins was discontinued. These early experimental coins are survived by only a handful, not more than a dozen, of such coins now. Great Rarity.

Also the weight of the coin was reduced by contemporary cheats by way of scrapping of edges to get silver and reduce the weight by a gram or so, the practice is found from ancient Gupta Empire to modern Princely States (kindly refer the Square Nazarana Mohur of Jaisalmer State, Lot# 429 in this auction).

The coin seems to be issued by the East India Company when they acquired the Bombay islands and were in need of local silver currency. Since the British did not had their own currency, they tried to mint locally a few silver coins in the name of Aurangzeb with the mint name **Mumbai**. Consequently, in 1693, as Khafi Khan has noted, the Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb was very displeased with the issue of these coins by the East India Company in Bombay. Aurangzeb took a strong exception to this minting. Consequently, the East India Company had to stop the minting and most of the minted coins were withdrawn and melted down. Quite later, during the time of Farrukhsiyar, the British got the Royal permission to mint coins in the name of Mughal Emperor and with the mint name Mumbai.





In case payment is not received within such period, this shall be treated as a breach of contract and the Rajgor's Auctions may take any steps, including the institution of legal proceedings, which are appropriate to enforce payment by the buyer. The buyer shall also be charged demurrage @ 1% per month on the value of the lots. In case of such defaulters the Rajgor's reserves the right to publish / announce their names on their website and at appropriate places.
