Closing of Internet Auction & Real-Time Bidding

Dear Patron,

An Internet Auction closes at a Pre-determined time, making all the Online Bidding stop at that point of time. However, if you are outbid in last few seconds on your coveted lots, than it is not possible to make a fresh Higher Bid and win that lot. Moreover, if you are bidding on more than one lots than it becomes very difficult to bid on those lots in last few minutes.

To overcome these problems, the Rajgor's have introduced a new system of Internet Bidding called Real-Time Bidding.

Real-Time Bidding

The Real-Time Bidding is quite like a Physical or Floor Auction Bidding. Lots in the above given categories will close according to the Bid-Closing Schedule as given above.

However, if there is Bid recorded within a span of 2 Minutes prior to the lot's scheduled closing time (say 3:00 pm), the Count-down Clock for that lot will be reset to 2 Minutes more and the closing time of that particular lot will be extended accordingly (3:02 pm).

Moreover, the said lot will be further extended for another 2 minutes if there is a Bid recorded within a span of 2 Minutes prior to the lot's new extended closing time (3:02 pm), making the extended time on that lot till 3:04 and not 3:02 pm. As a consequence, the bidding on that lot will be like the Real-Time Bidding as seen during the physical auction. Finally, Bidding on any lot will only end if there is no bid recorded for a span of 2 minutes.

This is how you can bid and win lots of your choice even if you are Out Bid at the last few seconds by a Proxy Bid or Secrete Bid of some other Bidder.

This new system of Internet Bidding gives you a chance of not losing your lots just by a few hundred rupees and become a proud owner of your items.

What is a Certified Coin?

A Certified Coin is a carefully studied, graded and certified as genuine coin, token, medal or a paper money, by an agency called a Grading company.

What is Grading?

Grading is a term applied to the physical condition of coins and notes that come in the hands of collectors and dealers. A coin/note in various stages of Grading will attract different prices. For example, a rare coin in the lower Grade of Fine (F) will fetch Rs. 2,000; but in the slightly higher Grade of Extremely Fine (XF) will not be available for even Rs. 10,000, and similarly a similar coin in the highest Grade of Uncirculated state (UNC or MS) will easily get a price tag of Rs. 25,000 or more. Hence the physical condition of a coin/note determines its market value. This determination of physical condition of a coin/note is called Grading and is graded as per a Grading Scale.

Grading Scale

Grading Scale is an index of measuring a coin's systematic wear & tear while in circulation and later by the handling of coin professionals.

Every coin-type wears systematically over a period of time. Similarly, coins and notes in the custody of collectors or with dealers degrade in their physical condition due to a number of reasons like improper handling, poor quality of albums, storing them together in a bag, weather effect and many more similar reasons.

This deterioration in the physical condition of a coin is represented by an International 70-Point Scale which was first employed in late 1940s in the USA. Since than this mode of numerical grades has become the standard of the numismatic industry.

However, different grading companies all over the world have modified this numerical scale to suit their own types of coins. This numerical scale is prefixed by a range of Prefix Adjectives that describe condition of a coin into 4 different groups. These are P, G, F and MS.

The Scale grades coins and notes on a numerical scale from 1 to 70 with the lowest being P 1 and the MS 70 (UNC 70 for notes) being the highest grade assigned to a normal circulated coin without any post-production imperfections.

Similarly, the same scale is also used for Proof and Pattern Coins. However, in case of Proof Coins, the grading is described with the prefix PF, like PF 45 or PF 63. The Proof-Like Coins have the Prefix PL and the rest of the concerned grade.

Prefix will be SP and the remaining part of the grade.

Banknotes and Paper Money are also Graded on a similar Scale with the Grades ranging from P to UNC, P being the lowest and UNC the highest.

In case of Pattern Coins, the grading is described with the prefix PT, like PT 45 or PT 63. And in case of Specimen, the

How Coins are Graded?

Coins and Banknotes are graded by an experienced numismatist called Grader. The Grader examines the items and Grades them according to their wear and tear and assigns an Alpha-Numeric Grade, like MS 61. Internationally, more than one Graders are involved in grading a coin or a note. This ensures that no mistakes are made in the process.

All the grading calculations are made under 5x magnification under white PL Light, and the Verification of authenticity of the coins/notes is done under the 15x magnification under white PL Light.

Advantages of Grading

There are many advantages of Grading:

- The very first thing a Graded coin or note signifies is that it is Genuine. Only genuine coins and banknotes are Graded while fakes or forgeries are never graded by the experts;
- The examination of authenticity is done by more than one experts of the field who have years of experience in the field;
- Coins and notes thus graded by the experts are sealed Ultra-sonically in very high quality Plastic Holders, called Slabs. This sealing of the numismatic objects has dual advantages: Firstly, the slabbed objects cannot be replaced by anyone so there is no chance of a cheating by anybody to fool a buyer; and secondly, this sealing in tamper-evident holders protects the objects from the atmosphere and save them from deteriorating, and also save them from mishandling by collectors/dealers;
- The collector is at peace as s/he no longer has to worry about the genuineness of coins & notes he is buying. This ensures that the unscrupulous people in the trade are filtered out of the business and collectors can safely park their money in certified numismatic objects;
- Grading of the notes and coins ensures that when a collector buys things of a particular grade, he gets what he has been promised to. This results in the transparency of the trade as a collector will no longer be cheated by buying a lower grade, say MS60 Grade instead of the promised MS65 Grade;

- A professional dealer creates an atmosphere of confidence among his cliental by supplying coins and notes thus graded and slabbed;
- The Graded slabs mean that they are certified and graded by respective experts, equipped with Bar Code and Hologram, and are Ultra-Sonically sealed in holders of highest quality meant for long-term storage and are tamper-evident so no one can replace the contents;

Branded Collection: The New Face of Collecting

With the advent of Grading companies in last decade throughout the world, the Collectors are now at ease in buying coins and banknotes from open market. Earlier, collectors were not sure about the genuineness, grade and proper identification of their coins and notes which they were buying from dealers. But now Graded coins and banknotes in Sealed Slabs mean that they are Genuine, properly deciphered and have the exact Grades. All these things are needed by a collector to build a beautiful collection.

Moreover, dealers also get good price for their Graded coins and notes as collectors want such Branded Coins from the Grading companies. This practice is also evident from coin auctions wherein an open coin/note fetches much less than the same thing in a Graded Holder. So the new collectors are building Branded Collections of coins and notes based on the Certified Holders from the Grading companies like the NGS.
