Ancient Coins (600 BC to AD 700)



The Swastika Coin, Mughal Empire, Muhammad Shah, Silver, Rupee, Shahbad Qanauj mint, complete mint name at bottom on rev, AH 1154, RY 23, with a Swastika placed in the right side of *Julus* and above *Zarb* on rev. *Very Fine+*, *Rare with Swastika*.

Estimate: ₹2,000-3,000

The Ganesha Coin, Mysore Kingdom of Tipu Sultan (18th century AD), 3, 3.03 g, 1 Kasu, Lord Ganesha seated, facing front with pot belly, both the hands raised side ways and holding divine weapons, an asana (stool) below. Nagari letters reading like Shri / Pa / jaamong a grid of line on rev (KM# 156). About Extremely Fine, toned, Rare in this grade.

Ancient Indian Primitive Money (c. 300-100 BC), a Taurine-shaped Bead from Ujjain (Madhya Pradesh) region. Gold, 0.07 g. The Taurine has a Crescent attached at the bottom of the bear making it two crescents on either side of the central portion. Finely carved out with sharp points. Extremely Fine+, Rare.

Ancient Indian Primitive Money (c. 300-100 BC), a **Taurine-shaped Bead** from Ujjain (Madhya Pradesh) region. Gold, 0.13 g. Taurine is an English name given to the Nandipada symbol in Indian mythology. Nandipada is basically the shape of a foot of a Nandi. One of the earliest forms of miniature tools in the Barter Trade was the copy of living animals, like cow and bulls. Since actual animals were not feasible to exchange in day-to-day transactions, their miniatures were made in precious and semi-precious metals so that they would serve the purpose as well as be convenient to handle also. As a result such gold beads became popular among the riches and businessmen. The bead has a small mount for threading at the back. *Very Fine, Rare*.

Ancient Indian Primitive Money (c. 300-100 BC), a **Lotus-shaped Bead** from Ujjain (Madhya Pradesh) region. Gold, 1.04 g. The *Padma* Lotus has six petals arranged around a solid circular centre, and a hollow rectangle at the back to pass through the thread. Finely carved out with round points. *Extremely Fine+*, *Rare*.

6 Ancient Indian Primitive Money (c. AD 400-500), Gold,1.93 g, **Snake or Naga-Devata**, Gujarat Region, Uninscribed with the hood of the snake raised and facing front, the typical style of the mythological Kundalini located at the base of the spinal cord. *Extremely Fine, Rare*.

Ancient Indian Primitive Money (c. AD 400-500), Gold, 0.06 g, **Inscribed Seal**, Gujarat Region, Brahmi inscription reading the name *Bhattasa* within a circular border on obverse and flatten loops for threading on reverse. *Extremely Fine, Rare*.



Ancient Indian Primitive Money (c. 300-100 BC), a set of 3 Bull-shaped Beads from Malwa (Madhya Pradesh) region. Copper (3), the smallest bead weighs 0.26 g, the medium bead weighs 0.53 g, and the heaviest bead weighs 0.66 g. All the three beads are carved in the shape of a Nandi Bull, the earliest medium of exchange among the primitives in the Barter Trade. The beads are pierced through in the centre of the bull to make them as a bead. Very Rare as a group of 3 Bull Beads in three different sizes and weights. The book, *Nishka: the Rigvedic Money*by Prof S K Bhatt is an authentic reference guide for the primitive money that were simultaneously current with Punch-marked coins in ancient India.

Ancient Indian Primitive Money (c. 300-100 BC), a set of 2 transparent Beads from Malwa (Madhya Pradesh) region. Copper (2), the smaller bead weighs 0.60 g and the bigger bead weighs 1.04 g. The beads are carved in the shape of a Fish and a Sword. Beads were the earliest medium of exchange among the primitives in the Barter Trade. The beads are pierced through in the centre to make them as a bead. Very Rare as a group. 2 beads

Ancient Mould (Central India, 2nd century BC), Copper, 92.99 g, 13x14 mm, an intricate design wit 4 parrots and flowery patterns in a detailed design made to cast impressions on terracotta pieces. The mould is important for the fact that it shows how the ancient terracotta art pieces were made and here is the example of a real mould wherein the actual designs are engraved. The Mould has a lid on the back which is now open and throws a flood of light on making it solid with mud. This system of mud-filling the mould saves metal cost and makes the mould heavy enough to stand the repeated use of making positives. Almost Extremely Fine, Rare item of ancient art.

Ancient Figurine (2nd century AD), Terracotta, 10.74 g, 33 x 35 mm, a beautiful figure of a Goddess, probably Durga seated cross-lagged and holding divine *ayudhas* in her two hands, the head is shown with a long headgear. Unifaced. *Very Fine+*, *Scarce*.

Punch-marked Coins, Kashi Janapada under the Kosala Janapada (c. 525-465 BC), Silver, 4.21 g, Vimshatika, four symbols type, Unifaced, with counter-marks on rev (Rajgor Series# 58). Very Fine, Scarce.

Punch-marked coins, Shakya Janapada (6th century BC), Silver, 6.39 g, Shatamana, single punch type with a circular punch made of three crescents symbol, around are a number of ancillary shrofff marks. *Scyphate*, *unifaced.Very Fine+*, *Scarce*.



18 **Indo-Greeks, Lysias**, Silver, 2.54 g, **Drachm**, helmeted bust of the king to right with Greek legend on obv, Greek God Zeus standing in the centre, facing front, with Kharoshti legend around on rev. *Extremely Fine+*, *Very Rare*.

19 **Indo-Parthians, Gondophares** (AD 20-50), Billon, 9.1 g, **Tetradrachm**, king mounted to right on a horse back, and Greek legend around on obv; Lord Shiva standing and holding a long trident in the centre and Kharoshthi legend around on rev. Northern Chach region (Mitch# 2577). *Very Fine, Rare*.

Coins of the Indo-Parthians are generally found with the Greek Deities like Zeus, Nike or Poseidon, however, the portraiture of Hindu God Shiva on this coin is quite rare.

20 **Panchala, Dhruvamitra** (2nd century BC), Copper, 4.33 g, die-struck type with a square die on obv having three symbols in the first line and Brahmi legend, *Dhruvamitasa* in the second line on obverse. Representation of a Stupa symbolizing Dharma (Religion),placed on a pedestal and flanked by two sacred *dhvajas* (banners) on either side on reverse. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce*.

Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,500

21 **Panchala, Rudragupta** (2nd century BC), Copper, 4.76 g, die-struck type with a square die on obv having three symbols in the first line and Brahmi legend, *Rudragaptasa* with retrograde *sa* in the second line on obverse. Representation of a Plough (*Hala*)-Standard placed on a pedestal, flanked by two sacred *dhvajas* (banners) on either side on reverse. *Extremely Fine, Rare ruler*.

Vidisha City State (c. 200 BC), Copper, 4.82 g, diestruck type with complete Brahmi legend reading from right to left, *Vedisasa* across the field on obv. It's a different type then the usual inscribed Vidisha coins found in Madhya Pradesh. Unifaced, *Very Fine+*, *Very Rare*.

Vidisha City State (c. 200 BC), Copper, 6.49 g, 30 x 25 mm, die-struck type with complete Brahmi legend reading from left to right, (*Ve)disasa* across the field, and an Elephant standing to left but placed side ways on obv. It's a totally new and different type then the usual inscribed Vidisha coins found in Madhya Pradesh. *Broad flan, Unifaced, Extremely Fine+, Extremely Rare.*

24 **Ujjayini** (2nd century BC), Copper, 4.53 g, uninscribed die-struck with an Elephant walking to right and standing on a pedestal on obv; an Ujjayini symbol on rev. *Very Fine with green patina, Scarce*.

25 **Ujjayini** (2nd century BC), Copper, 6.66 g, uninscribed die-struck type with the usual six-armed symbol, tree in railing, river and hill symbols on obv, but with Shiva-Mahakal figure standing to front, holding a Danda and a Kamandu on rev. *Very Fine+*, *Rare type*.

26 **Ujjayini** (2nd century BC), Lead, 2.21 g, die-struck with an elephant picking leaves from a tree-in-railing in the left field and a small Ujjyini symbol over its back on obverse; typical Shiva standing with Damru and Kamandalu type with a big Taurine in the left field and ancillary symbols above on reverse. *About Extremely Fine, Rare*.

27 **Ujjayini** (2nd century BC), Copper, 0.48 g, a tree in railing in the centre on obv, traces of Brahmi characters on rev. *About Extremely Fine, Scarce*.

28 **Kurpurika City-State** (200 BC), Copper, 4.73 g, Inscribed-Lion type with a lion facing right, a tree in railing on left, an Ujjayini symbol on right and a Triangle-headed Standard at the back of the animal, Brahmi legend above the animal. *Unifaced. Extremely Fine+*, *Very Rare.*

Kurpurika City-State (200 BC), Copper, 3.81 g, Brahmi legend Kurpurika in the upper line followed by a punch consisting of an Ujjayini symbol and a Triangle-headed Standard called Indra-Dhvaja. Unifaced. Extremely Fine, Extremely Rare to find with full legend and in this pristine condition. A similar coin was recently sold by the Rajgor's for 22,000/-

30 **Kurpurika City-State** (200 BC), Copper, 6.02 g, Brahmi legend Kurpurika in the upper line followed by a punch consisting of an Ujjayini symbol and a Triangle-headed Standard called Indra-Dhvaja. Restruck on the same coin, Unifaced. Extremely Fine, Extremely Rare to find with full legend and in this pristine condition with Restriking on the same type of the coin.

Post-Mauryans of South Vidarbha, Patalatolata (c. 150-100 BC), Copper, 5.04 g, a bull walking to right, a tree in railing in its front and a river with fishes below; Brahmi legend reading *Patalatolatasa* above the bull on obv; a sunburst symbol surrounded by two Shrivatsa symbols on rev. *Very Fine, Rare*.

32 **Pre-Satavahanas of Northern Maharashtra** (1st century BC), Copper, 8.56 g, a bull standing to right and minor symbols above its back, the whole execution is in a circular punch-like die on obverse; traces of a tree in railing on rev. *Very Fine for the type, Scarce*.

33 **Pre-Satavahanas of Northern Maharashtra** (1st century BC), Copper, 7.26 g, an elephant with upraised trunk to right embedded in a punch on obv, traces of a few symbols on rev. *About Very Fine, Scarce*.

34 **Early Satavahanas** (1st century BC), Copper, 1.43 g, a Stupa with three-arched hill on obverse and an Ujjyini symbol with a dot in each orb on rev. Anonymous. *Very Fine+*, *Scarce*.

35 **Satavahanas, Vasithiputra Siri Satakarni**, Silver, 1.41 g, Portrait type, bust of the king to right on obv and his name with metronymic on obv, hill, Ujjayini symbol and Brahmi-Telugu legend on rev. Two minor holes for use as a locket. *Very Fine, Scarce*.

36 **Satavahanas**, Lead (3), 4.33, 3.80 and 2.22 g, numerous types with an animal (Elephant/Lion) on obv and a tree in railing on rev. *Very Fine, Scarce. 3 coins*

37 **Satavahanas**, Copper, 14.13 g, an Elephant to left with a Swastika above its back on obverse; a tree in railing on rev. *About Very Fine, Scarce*.

38 Satavahanas, Copper (4), Yajna Satakarni (2), Shri Satakarni and Pulumavi, Elephant standing to right with Brahmi legend at top referring to the names of the rulers on obv, Ujjayini symbol on rev. Very Fine+. 4 coins

39 **Western Kshatrapas, Nahapana**, Silver, 2.00 g, **Karshapana**, Portrait type with three languages and three scripts on the coin having Greek on obverse, Kharoshthi and Brahmi on reverse around the thunderbolt and arrow. Complete legends on the reverse. *Almost Mint state, Rare in this grade*.

40 **Western Kshatrapas, Chashtana son of Ghsamotika**, Silver, 2.15 g, **Karshapana**, Portrait type with three languages and three scripts on the coin having Greek on obverse, Kharoshthi and Brahmi on reverse around the thunderbolt and arrow. Two legends on the reverse. *Extremely Fine, Rare in this grade*.

41 **Western Kshatrapas, Potin**, 2.06, Facing Bull type, anonymous, a bull seated facing front on obv, three arched hill and a wavy line on rev. *Very Fine+*, *Scarce*.

Western Kshatrapas, **Potin**, 1.36, Facing Bull type, anonymous, a bull seated facing front on obv, three arched hill and a wavy line on rev. *Fine+*, *Scarce*.

44 **Kushanas, Kanishka** I, Gold, 7.81 **Dinar**, King standing facing left with complete Kushano-Greek legend around on obverse; the Greek God Mao, the Lunar deity, standing to left and a crescent behind his head to his divine status, and label in the right field reads, **MAO**, and a beaded border around on reverse. *A minor scratch on the edge, else About Extremely Fine, Rare.*

Estimate: ₹80,000-90,000

45 **Kushanas, Kanishka I** (2nd century AD), a **Terracotta Mould**, 5.88, for manufacturing gold Dinar coins of Kanishka of king standing type on obv. The mould exhibits the typical Kushana king standing to right with a hand stretched out to offer to the Fire Altar placed near his legs. Such incused negative moulds were largely used to forge Kushana gold coins in the Haryana region at a mass scale. *Very Rare to find a mould of the Kushanas*.

Estimate: ₹ 1,800-2,500



46 **Kushanas, Kanishka I**, Copper, 4.73 g, **UrdhvaLinga Shiva type**, the king standing to left with offering in the Fire Altar near his right leg and legend around on obverse. Lord Shiva standing with a single head and holding a trident in his right hand, his left hand is hanging by the waist and Greeko legend in the right field reading OSHO. *Very Fine, Rare*.

Estimate: ₹ 2,000-3,000



Kushanas, Huvishka, (c. AD 152-192), Gold, 7.61 g, Dinar, Farro type, king nimbate, diademed and crowned half-length bust sitting to left on clouds, holding mace-scepter and filleted spear on obverse; Greek God Pharo (Fire-God, Hermes-Mercury), standing left, nimbate and wearing winged petasos, holding a bowl of Fire in the extended right hand and filleted scepter in the left hand; a tamgha to left below the fire bowl. *Very Fine+*, *Rare*.

48 **The Roman Empire, Septimius Severus** (AD 193-211), Gold, 7.16 g, **Aureus**, AD 202-210, SEVERVS – PIVS AVG Laureate, draped and cuirassed bust r on obverse; INDVLGEN – TIA AVGG The Goddess Dea Caelestis is riding right on a lion, holding drum in right hand and sceptre in left; below, water gushing from rock. In exergue, IN CARTH.(C# 217; BMC# 333; RIC#267b, Calicó#2462). *Very Fine*+, *Very Rare*.

The rare type, INDVLGENTIA AVGG IN CARTH (the indulgence of the Augusti towards Carthage), suggests Septimius Severus and Caracalla made improvements to Carthage, the North African capital to the west of the imperial family's native Tripolitana. It seems the imperial family and its entourage crossed to Africa in 202, a few months after they had returned to Rome from a five-year absence in the East. The reverse depicts a towered Goddess sitting upon a lion that springs from a rocky outcrop from which water flows. This latter feature has led to the suggestion that aqueducts or waterworks of some kind in Carthage were constructed or repaired at the State expense.

49 Yaudheyas (4th century AD), Terracotta, 5.12 g, Mould for manufacturing copper coins of the Yaudheyas of Lord Kartikeya type on obv. The incused negative mould depicts God Kartikeya standing, facing front and holding a scepter, his divine vehicle a Cock near his legs, and Brahmi legend around reading, Yaudheya Ganas Jayaha. These moulds were largely used to manufacture such Yaudheya coins in the Haryana region at a mass scale. Rare.

The Gupta Empire, Samudragupta, (AD 335-380), Gold 7.74g, Dinar, Kacha type, king nimbate standing to left, holding a wheel-headed standard in his left hand, Brahmi legend (Kacho Gamavajatya Divam) Karmabhiruttamair jayati (= having conquered the earth, Kacha wins the heaven by excellent deeds) in the right field and Kacha written vertically below the king's elbow on obverse; Goddess Lakshmi standing to left holding a cornucopia with Brahmi legend Sarvarajochchhetta (Exterminator of all Kings) in the right field (BMC-II-11, Altekar var.A, IV-1, Bayana Hoard 201, VII-3). Very Fine, Rare.

The Gupta Empire, Samudragupta (AD 330-380), Gold, 7.38 g, Dinar, Lyrist type, the King seated on a high-backed throne, playing a Veena that rests on his knees; on footstool the Brahmi character 'Si' for Siddham (Success!); Brahmi legend in the margin reads, Maharajadhiraja Sri Samudraguptah, on obverse. Goddess Lakshmi, nimbate, seated left on a wicker stool, holding a diadem fillet in her right hand and a cornucopia in the left, Brahmi legend: Samudraguptah in the right field behind on reverse. The legs of the Goddess are placed over a Lotus in the left field, which otherwise is never seen on these Lyrist coins (Similar to Variety A (Plate III-16; but the present design of a Kamal Lotus beneath her legs on the reverse are not listed by Altekar in his master work, the Bayana Hoard; BMC-GD 52, 54; MACW #4789/90). Extremely Fine, Extremely Rare.

The Gupta Empire, **Chandragupta II** (AD 380-414), Gold, 7.81 g, Dinar, **Lion-Trampling type**, king slaying a lion with a bow and arrow, the arrow piercing right into the jaw of the lion while the lion is trying to snatch at the bow by his fore paw, on obverse. Goddess **Durga seated astride** on lion to right, holding a lotus in right hand, which ousts the usual symbol; her left hand is hanging down empty by her side; the Brahmi legend in the right field behind her reads, **Sinhavikramaha** (Class II, Var. Urdu was the name of a Royal Camp mint. While the Royal army on move was going from place to place in order to conquer new and far distant regions of India, the Mughals, especially Akbar devised a "Portable Mint" that moved along with the Royal Mughal Army. The make-shift Mint had dual purpose: a) When a new fort or a city was conquered, the mint masters will immediately engrave new dies with the name of that place and struck coins to commemorate their victory over the enemy and hence record their victory in tangible forms; and b) in order to make payments to the army, the military officers constantly needed new supply of coined money, which was not possible to get enroute a distant place from the Capital. Hence the Mobile Mint minted coins during their halts and supplied fresh coins to be paid as wages. To solve the problem of the Mint Name on these coins, the Mughals devised a new Mint Name called Urdu, which was written on those coins. Historically, the word Urdu is derived from the Turkic word Ordu, which means Army!
