Ancient Coins (600 BC to AD 700)







1 Earliest Swastika on Pottery piece, post-Kushan period, c. $3^{rd} - 4^{th}$ centuries AD, Red Terracotta Ware, Haryana region, 12.66 g, 55 x 33 mm, 6 mm thick. A bold anti-clockwise Swastika punched in the centre just below the rim of the Pot. Uncleaned, Extremely clear Swastika symbol. Extremely Rare to find no a piece of pottery.

Swastika symbol is quite rare to appear in pre-Gupta era. This piece of history is a piece of a pottery of the post-Kushan period and is significant in having the clear sacred symbol of Swastika.

2 **Punch-marked Coins, Shakya Janapada**, c. 6th century BC, Silver, 6.83 g, **Shatamana**, single punch type with a circular punch made of three crescents in centre, around a number of ancillary symbols. Scyphate, Very Fine+, Rare.

3 Punch-marked Coins, **Gandhara Janapada**, c. 5th century BC, Silver, 1.42 g, **Shana (1/8 Shatamana)**, single symbol type, with a single central symbol in the centre (Rajgor Series 41). Squarish shape, Scyphate, centrally punch, Absolutely Fine, Scarce.

4 Punch-marked Coins, **Surashtra Janapada**, c. 450-300 BC, Silver, 0.90 g, ¼ **Kasrhapana**, a Bull walking to left on obverse. Multi-struck type. Very Fine, Scarce. Estimate: ₹ 1,000-1,500

5 Punch-marked Coins, **Surashtra Janapada**, c. 450-300 BC, Silver, 0.45 g, **1/8 Kasrhapana**, a Shrivatsa in centre on obverse. Multi-struck type. Very Fine, Very Rare as this is a half unit of the usual Surashtra coins. Estimate: ₹ 2,500-4,500

6 Punch-marked Coins, **Surasena Janapada**, c. 450-300 BC, Silver, 1.79 g, ½ **Kasrhapana**, a stylized Lion to right and a Fish placed on the lion on obverse. Unifaced type. Very Fine, Scarce. Estimate: ₹ 900-1,500



7 Punch-marked Coins, Magadha Mahajanapada, c. 600 BC, Silver, 1.82 g, ¼ Vimashatika, Heavy Weight series of Single symbol series. A big six-armed symbol with 3 arrows and 3 circles alternating around a central circle. Unifaced. Extremely Fine+, 1st Known coin and Unique denomination.

Similar single symbol silver coins with a Six-armed symbol are known as Series 8 (Rajgor Type 43). Such single symbol coins in Electrum are also known in private collections (Rajgor Series 7). However, a half unit of Series 8 was not known earlier. This is a perfect piece without any filling marks on the edge and the coin has original edge. The discovery of this fraction of Series 8 coins suggest that Magadha Mahajanapada had a elaborate numismatic coinage in silver and in gold with main unit and its fractions. A great piece of Indian numismatic history!

It appears that the sealing was fixed on a merchandise and displayed the name of the trader-owner as a mark of identification. About Extremely Fine, Rare. Estimate: ₹ 1,500-3,000



14 Eran-Vidisha, 3rd century BC, Copper, 9.89 g, Punch-marked type, four-symbols type, River with Fishes; Elephant, an Ujjayini symbol and a Horse on obverse. Unifaced. About Extremely Fine, Rare. Estimate: ₹ 2,500-3,500

15 Eran-Vidisha, 3rd century BC, Copper, 4.41 g, Punch-marked type, five-symbols type, River with Fishes; Elephant, an Indra-Dhvaja or a Triangle-headed Standard in a Railing; a Taurin symbol in a U-shape motif; and in the centre, a Tree in Railing on obverse. Unifaced. About Extremely Fine, Half denomination, Rare. Estimate: ₹ 2,000-4,500

16 Eran-Vidisha, 3rd century BC, Copper, 5.14 g, Die-struck type, a Nandi Bull standing to right, facing a Yupa, and an Ujjayini symbol above on obverse. A decorated Shrivatsa symbol having four top portions of the sacred symbol, placed around the central circle on reverse. About Extremely Fine, Rare. Estimate: ₹ 2,000-3,500



17 Indo-Greeks, Eucratides (170-145 BC), Silver, 2.96 g, Attic standard Drachm, BN Series 6, Obv: Bust of king facing right, wearing diadem and a Macedonian helmet adorned with a plume, a bull's horn and ear. Rev: Castor and Pollux (the Dioskuroides), wearing conical hats and carrying lances and palm fronds, riding prancing horses facing right; Greek legend BASILEOS MEGALOU EUKRATIDOU around and a monograph beneath the horse's hoofs. About Very Fine, Very Rare as a fraction.

18 Indo-Greeks, Apollodotus I (180-160 BC), BN Series 6, Copper, 9.46 g. Obv: Apollo standing holding bow and arrow, Greek legend BASILEOS APOLLODOTOUS SOTEROS. Rev: Tirpod in center within dotted border, monogram to right, Kharosthi legend Maharajasa Apaladatasa Tratarasa. About Extremely fine, Scarce. Estimate: ₹ 2,500-3,000

19 Indo-Greeks, **Apollodotus II** (80-65 BC), uninscribed, Copper, 2.37 g. Obv: Bull walking to right. Within a border Rev: Tripod of the Greek God Apollo. BN series 19. Very Fine+, Scarce. Estimate: ₹ 2,000-3,000



20 Indo-Scythians, Azes, Copper, 2.74 g, bust of the king to right with Greek legend around on obverse, Greek God Zeus standing facing front and holding a mace in his right hand, and Kharoshthi legend around on reverse. Very Fine+, Scarce.

21 **Datta Rulers of Mathura, Purushadatta** (c. 1st century BC), Copper, 6.69 g, obv. Goddess Lakshmi standing on a Lotus Padma, facing front, with one arm raised, tree to left and a Shrivatsa symbol on lower-right, with Brahmi legend above (Puru)shadattasa on obverse. Traces of elephants facing (Pieper 1271). Very Fine but the reverse obliterated, Rare. Purushadatta ruled over the Mathura region after the collapse of the Sunga Empire. Coins of this ruler of Mathura are very rare.

23 **Maharathis of Andhra**, c. 2nd century BC, Copper, 3.52 g, an elephant walking to right with Brahmi legend reading like Pusa Varunas? On obverse. A classic form of Tree in railing on reverse. About Extremely Fine for the type, Rare.


30 **Satavahanas**, Copper, 2.66 g, multi-Ujjayini symbol on obverse with a big taurine on obverse, a Ten-arched hill symbol on reverse. Extremely Fine, Scarce.

31 Post-Satavahana Central India, Copper, 4.93 g, Gautamiputra Vishakhadatta (AD 150-200), a Nandipada enclosed in a rectangle in the center, flanked by a standard/sword to the right, Brahmi legend (Rajño Gotami) putasa Shri Vi (shakhadattasa) around. Unifaced. Unpublished only one coin of this ruler is known with full name. Extremely Fine+, Rare.

It is not known to which dynasty the king Gautamiputra Vishakhadatta belonged but it is certain that he must have risen to power in the aftermath of the Satavahana power being gradually eliminated from Vidarbha and the regions of Central India immediately to the North. A power struggle appears to have erupted here with the Maghas, the Nagas and the Vakatakas contesting for supremacy.



A fain-tailed Peacock in the centre facing left, Brahmi legend, *Vijitavanirvanivanipatir jayati divam* Skandagupto'yam around. Kumar Variety A. Year not listed. Very Fine+ with clear Year Numerals in Brahmi make this coin Very Rare.

52 Gupta Empire, **Skandagupta**, AD 455-485, **Lead**, 2.22 g, Garuda type, Garuda, the divine vehicle of Lord Vishnu with outspread wings on obverse. Brahmi legend, Skandaguptasya in the centre, a wheel in the first line, a Gupta Era year 146 (= AD 466). This is one of the earliest years found on lead coins of Skandagupta. Most of the times, the year numerals are not complete and hence rarity of such coins with full year numerals.

Rev: goddess seated facing over a resting lion, holding cornucopia; Kalasha in the left field, the lion's face visible below her knee. Very fine, Rare.
