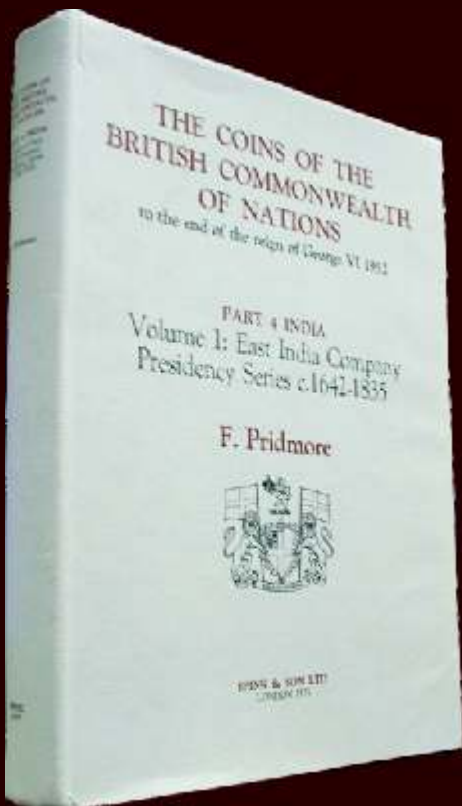

Ancient Coins (600 BC to AD 700)

Swastika, the sign for Sanskrit word Siddham stands for Success. The root of Swastika is found at least before 5,000 years in the Indus-Valley Civilization. In ancient India, it was a practice to start any new work by drawing the Swastika in the beginning. In numerous inscriptions and on Copper-Plates we find Swastika is drawn and then follows the main course of the text. Hence keeping this ancient Hindu Tradition alive, we are beginning the Rajgor's 1st Auction with a coin depicting Swastika and thereby meaning Success to all our Collector friends... Amen!

Punch-marked Coins, Matsya Janapada (Western Uttar Pradesh in the Agra region), 5th century BC, Silver, 3.07 g, **Karshapana**, Agra Hoard type, a bold **Swastika** to right with small dots in each segment. *The single-symbol, uniface coin is centrally punched. Rare. Not listed in any catalogues and a Very Rare symbol to appear in Punch-marked coin series right from 600 BC to 50 BC. Only 3 examples of Swastika are found in Punch-marked coinage: Andhra Janapada (Rajgor# 15) and Kosala Janapada (Rajgor# 949 and 951). Unpublished and Very Interesting, and First Known Coin.*

2,500-3,000
Punch-marked Coins, Ayodhya, 5th century BC, Silver, 6.96 g, **5 Shana**, single symbol type with a central symbol and minute counter-marks around representing bankers marks. Unifaced. *Very Fine+ for the type, not listed by Rajgor, neither under the Shakya Janapada nor in the Ayodhya series. Unpublished, Rare.*

2,200-2,400
Punch-marked coins, Shakya Janapada of the Lord Buddha (northern Uttar Pradesh and Nepal hills), 6th century BC, Silver, 6.81 g, **5 Shana**, single symbol consisting of a pellet in the centre and 5 crescents around. Minute bankers marks near the periphery. *About Extremely Fine, Scyphate, Rare.*



4
1,200-1,500
Punch-marked Coins, Vanga Janapada, 2nd century BC, Billon, 2.52 g, **Karshapana**, 3 + 1 Symbols, Sun, Six-armed symbol, and a riverine boat on obv, a Conch shell on rev. The presence of a boat on the coin suggests the riverine trade of the Vanga (modern Bengal) people. *About UNC for the type as all the symbols are clear enough, Rare in this condition.*

1,900-2,000
Punch-marked Coins, Post-Mauryas, Mathura region, 2nd century BC, Silver, **Karshapana**, 5 + 1 Symbols, the five symbols on obv consist of a Sun, six-armed symbol, a monk standing on the back of a Bull, representing **Lord Shiva on his Nandi** vehicle, an ornate standard symbol, and a human figure standing to right with left hand raised in air and holding a plough and a staff (*Danda*) in the right hand, depicting **Lord Balaram**, the elder brother of **Lord Krishna**. The 6th symbol shows the same figure of Lord Shiva standing to left but without Nandi Bull. *Depiction of Hindu God Balaram and Krishna was a total novelty in the Punch-marked coins as the belt of Mathura in 2nd century BC was profusely influenced by the worship of Lord Krishna and Balaram, and discovery of hundreds of stone sculptures of these two Heroes of Mahabharata is a proof of this influence. As a natural consequence, the local Punch-marked coins are also influenced by the depiction of Balaram. About UNC, Unpublished, Rare.*

1,800-2,000
Mauryas, 3rd century BC, Copper, 5.44 g, **Uninscribed Cast, Double Unit** with a casting joint in the centre, an elephant walking to left on obv, a three-arched hill with a crescent at top on rev. *About Extremely Fine for the type, Scarce.*



7
 1,800-2,000
 Punch-marked Coins, **Post-Mauryas**, 1st century BC, Silver, **Karshapana**, 5 + 1 symbols, a peacock, a scale and a single punch with 3 human figures with the right one looking like a female, the sixth punch of a peacock on a hill on rev (Gupta & Hadaker# 590).

The Punch-marked coins are being studied for iconography and a close study at the Post-Mauryan period reveals that they do follow certain Hindu iconography. The present coin shows the three human figures who can be identified, from left to right, Lakshman, Rama and Sita. Probably these lots are the earliest evidences where we find icons of Balaram, Shiva and the three Ramayana deities. About Extremely Fine, Rare.

 ₹ 2,200-2,500
City-State of Erikutch, 2nd century BC, Copper, 4.26 g, Cast, Brahmi legend *erikutcham* in the centre line on obv. *Very Fine+, Scarce.*



9
 2,500-3,000
Ujjayini, 2nd century BC, Lead, 13.06 g, a Nandipada (*literally* Cow's foot) at bottom centre, two minute Swastikas at the top corners on obv, an Ujjayini symbol and a staff with a base on rev. Uninscribed. *Extremely Fine, Unpublished, Rare.*

 1,500-2,000
Indo-Greeks, Menander, 2nd century BC, Silver, 2.37 g, **Drachme**, diademed bust of the ruler to right and Greek legend around on obv, Greek Goddess Athena standing to left holding a thunderbolt and a shield in the centre and Kharoshthi legend around on rev. *Very Fine+, Scarce.*



11
 ₹ 3,500-4,000
Indo-Greeks, Apollodotus II, 2nd century BC, Copper, 14.15 g, Greek God Apollo standing to right and Greek legend around on obv, Tripod of God Apollo in the centre and Kharoshthi legend around on rev. *A small portion of the edge is off flan otherwise Extremely Fine, and Rare.*

 2,500-3,000
Tripuri (Jabalpur), 2nd century BC, **Gotamiputra Vishakhadutta**, a Shrivatsa symbol in the central square and Brahmi legend around on obv, rev is blank.

The ruler and his coin was unpublished till 2008 when Kulkarni published it for the first time in a numismatic souvenir at Indore. This is the only example when we find a ruler named Vishakhadutta is found, otherwise the name only appears in the Sanskrit literature of Kalidas. Very Fine for the type, Rare.

 4,000-4,500
Satavahanas, Gotamiputra Yajna Satakarni, 1st century AD, Silver, **Portrait** type, a typical bust of the ruler with a hair bun near his head and Brahmi legend citing his Queen-Mother's name on obv; Hill and Ujjayini symbol and Telugu-Brahmi legend around on rev (Mitch# 156). *Fine+, Rare ruler.*

 3,500-4,000
Satavahanas, Vasishthiputra Shri Pulumavi, Silver, 1.20 g, **1/2 Dramma**, Portrait type with Brahmi legend *pulumav ...* readable behind the head on obv, usual hill-Ujjayini symbol motif and legend on rev (cf Mtch# 145). *Fractions of the Portrait coins are rare no Halves of this ruler are known. Two tiny holes meant for contemporary pendent use. Fine+, Very Rare.*

 2,000-2,500
Kushanas, Wima Takto alias Soter Megas, 2nd century AD, Copper, 8.18 and 1.97 g, **1 & 1/4 Units**, helmeted bust of the king to right on obv, a horseman to right with Greek legend around on rev. *Both About Extremely Fine, Scarce as a set of 2*

 1,800-2,000
 Ancient **Haryana, Vidishagupta**, 3rd century AD, Copper, 1.99 g, Brahmi legend *Vidi .. / gup..* near a trident on obv, a cross-legged human seated on rev. *Fine+, Rare.*

Western Kshatrapas, **Nahapana**, 1st century AD, Silver, 2.35 g, **portrait type**, tri-lingual, thunderbolt and arrow on rev with Brahmi and Kharoshthi legends around. Broad unusual flan with complete die impressions on rev, making the coin a well-come addition for collectors. *Extremely Fine, Rare in this flan.*

Western Kshatrapas, **Nahapana**, 1st century AD, **Copper**, 2.98 g, Junnar type with a thunderbolt and arrow in the centre and Brahmi legend, ...*kshaharatasa* ...around on obv; a tree in railing on rev. *Very Fine+, Rare.*



19
Western Kshatrapas, **Ishvaradutta**, Silver, **Dramma**, As Mahakshatrapa, **Year 1, Prathme** (the First Year), portrait type. *Full date on obv and Extremely Fine and Better, Scarce.*



20
Western Kshatrapas, **Bhartrdaman**, Silver, **Dramma Lakhi**, portrait type, typical bust of the ruler to right on obv negative and incused bust of the obv or *Lakhi* (brockage) on rev. *Graded and slabbed by NGS as XF 40 Lakhi, Scarce.*

Western Kshatrapas, **Rudrasena III, son of Rudradaman II**, Silver, **Dramma**, portrait type, dated **Saka 290 and 292** (AD 368 and 370), as Mahakshatrapa. Complete dates on obv behind the head. *About UNC, Rare with complete dates. 2 coins*

Guptas, Skandagupta, Lead, 1.69 g, Garuda type, Garuda seated and facing on front, Brahmi legend ... *skandaguptasya* / and date in Gupta Era, **144** (AD 464). *Dated lead coins of the Guptas are difficult to come across and that too with all the three digits. Fine+, Scarce.*



23
Yaudheya Republic, 4th century AD, **Complete set of 3 types**, Copper, Dramma, God Kartikeya, the Lord of War according to the Hindu mythology standing facing front with a spear in his right hand and the left resting on his waist, a peacock, his vehicle near his left feet, and Brahmi legend *yaudheya ganasa jaya*, hail the Yaudheya Republic, on obv; three varieties of rev type: Devasena, the wife of Yaudheya is standing to left with her right hand raised in the air and the left resting on her waist, the three types include a conch-shell in the left field below her right hand; a Kalasa or *Purna Kumbha*, and empty field below her right hand. *It is for the first time that all the three types of these coins have surfaced in any auction. Very Fine+ to About Extremely Fine, Rare as a set of 3*



24
Kalachuris, Shankargana (7th century AD), Silver, 0.42 g, a portrait to right on obv, Brahmi legend in two lines on rev. *This is the smallest denomination, weighing just half a gram of the famous Kalachuri dynasty of Western India. Very Fine for the type, Scarce.*



25
Kalachuris, Krishnarajdeva, 6th century AD, Silver, **Kalachuri Dramma**, portrait on obv, a seated Bull to right in the centre and Brahmi legend around on rev. *These coins were issued in and around Mumbai (Bombay) region and were chiefly found in the Elephant Island precincts in the last century. Very Fine+, Scarce.*



26 ~ 2,000-2,200
Rashtrakutas, Silver, 0.38 g, an elephant walking to right on obv, Brahmi legend around a central deity figure with cross-legged and folded hands and nimbate on rev. *Unpublished, Very Fine, Scarce.*

27 ₹ 1,500-1,700
Vishnukudins, Bell metal, 9.44 g, conch shell (*shankha*) on obv in an ornate rayed border, and a lion roaring to right with a Shrivatsa symbol near its mouth on rev. *Very Fine+, Scarce.*



28 ~ 4,500-5,000
Vishnukundins, Copper, 4.68 g, unusually depicted Conch Shell (*Shankha*) in the centre with two lamp-post-type pillars on either sides, probably suggesting the Attendants of the Divine *Shankha* on obv, a roaring lion standing to right facing a Shrivatsa symbol near its mouth on rev. *Extremely Fine, Unpublished, Rare.*

29 ~ 1,500-1,700
Vishnukundins, 7th century AD, Copper, 3.34 g, Conch-shell (*Shankha*) on obv, Lion to right on rev, Brahmi legend above the lion reading, *shri ...* *Graded and slabbed by NGS as VF 30. Scarce.*



30 ~ 50,000-60,000
Kadambas of Goa, 12th century AD, **Gold**, 4.35 g, **Pagoda**, a lion seated to left with right leg upraised towards a pillar on obv; a **traditional temple** on rev. Anonymous and undated. *Graded and slabbed by NGS as F 15, with Certificate of Authenticity. Unpublished, probably First known Coin.*



31 ~ 50,000-60,000
Chalukyas of Kalyan, 10th century AD, **Gold**, 4.38 g, **Pagoda**, a well-designed square form with pellets in each corners and minute orientations in each sides of the square on obv, a **traditional temple** formed by lines on dots on rev. Anonymous. *Graded and slabbed by NGS as MS 60 Prime, with Certificate of Authenticity. Unpublished, probably First known Coin.*



32 ~ 50,000-60,000
Chalukyas of Kalyan, 10th century AD, **Gold**, 4.40 g, **Pagoda**, an ornate **8-rayed lotus (Padma)** in centre on obv, uniface with minute counter-marks on rev. Anonymous. *Graded and slabbed by NGS as XF 40, with Certificate of Authenticity. Unpublished, probably First known Coin.*



33 ~ 1,800-2,000
Feudatory Chiefs of Gersoppa - Nagire, **Saluva Malla** with the title *Rajadhiraja*, Silver, 1.96 g, **Pagoda**, a lion facing left on obv; Nagari legend *Rajadhiraja* on rev. *Centrally punched, Extremely Fine, Scarce.*



34 ~ 1,300-1,500
Chalukyas of Gujarat, **Siddharaj Jayasimha** and **Rana Hasti**, Silver, 0.63 and 0.40 g, **Hasti Dramma**, an elephant to right on obv, Nagari legend on rev. *Both with nearly complete legends, About Extremely Fine, Scarce. 2 coins*



35 ~ 2,500-3,000
Chalukyas of Gujarat, **Karnadeva Waghela**, 10th century AD, Copper, 3.32 g, a vase (***Purna Kumbha***) placed in a square on obv, Nagari legend in two lines reading, *shri ka.. / devasa* on rev. Karnadeva was the last Hindu ruler of Gujarat who was followed by the onslaught on the Muslim invaders. *About Extremely Fine, Rare.*



36 2,500-3,000
Kalachuris of Tripuri, Gangeya Deva, Base Gold, 3.65 g, **Dramma**, Lakshmi type with Nagari legend in three lines on rev (Deyell# 119). *About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*



37 6,000-6,500
Vijayanagara Empire, Hari Hara II (AD 1377-1404), Gold, 1.75 g, ½ **Pagoda**, **Shiva-Parvati** seated on obv., Nagari legend mentioning the rulers name, *shri pra / tap hari* on rev (Mitch# 412). *About Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

Anonymous, Gold, 3.36 g, **Hudki Pagoda**, possibly depiction the famous **Gol Gumbaj** of Bijapur on obv; a boat-like uncertain symbol on rev; these two symbols were once identified as **genitals** of male and female, however there is no confirmation about this theory. Without initials on obv (GG# BJ 49). *UNC, Scarce.*



39 1,200-1,500
Ali Adil Shah II (AD 1656-1672), Silver, 4.75 g, **Larin**, **Dabhol Mint** (G&G# BJ 37). Complete die impressions on both the sides. *Extremely Fine+, Rare in this grade.*

40 ₹ 2,800-3,000
Nasir ud din Mahmud Shah I, Silver, 11.55 g, **Tanka**, **Muhammadabad mint**, AH 896, date below on the rev, square-area type (G&G# G112). *Heavy Tankas of Gujarat are difficult to find. About UNC, Rare.*

Muhammad Shah II, Silver, **Tanka**, **Hazrat Ahsanabad** mint, mint name partly visible at left margin on rev, AH 79(1), *al-muqtafi* legend (Rajgor# 2551; G&G# BH51). *Broad flan, Extremely Fine, Scarce.*

Muhammad Shah bin Muzaffar Shah, Silver, **Tanka**, **Shadiabad** urf **Mandu** mint, AH 963 (Rajgor# 3236; G&G# M230). *Very Fine+, Scarce.*

Akbar, Silver, **Square Rupee**, **Mintless type**, **Allahu Akbar** on obv, *jale jalalhu* and **Ilahi 33** on rev. Both the side legends in square solid and dotted borders with the beautiful Mughal calligraphy. *Deep struck, Extremely Fine, Rare.*



44 1,800-2,000
Akbar, Silver, **Square Rupee**, **Ahmedabad mint**, mint name at bottom on rev is out of flan, **Kalima** type, AH 1000. *Very Fine, AH date 1000 on all coins of Akbar is usually found in words, Alif but on this rare coin it is written in numerals. Unusual.*



45 ₹ 3,500-4,000
Akbar, Silver, **Rupee**, **Ahmedabad mint**, **Allahu Akbar** type, **Shahrewar Month**, **Ilahi 4x**, . A Rare Month and incomplete coin in many of the 12 Month Sets. *Very Fine, Scarce.*



46 ~ 4,000-4,500
Akbar, Silver, **Rupee, Ahmedabad mint**, Allahu Akbar type, 4 different Months: Tir, Aban, Azar and Khurdad. *Very Fine, Scarce. 4 coins*



47 ~ 3,200-3,500
Akbar, Silver, Square **Rupee, Bung (Bengal) mint**, Kalima type, nearly complete mint name at bottom on rev, AH 1004. *Very Fine, Rare.*



48 ~ 2,000-2,200
Akbar, Silver, **Square Rupee, Delhi mint**, Allahu Akbar type with the mint name at bottom on obv, Di month. *Very Fine, Scarce.*



49 ~ 1,700-2,000
Akbar, Silver, 5.51 g, **1/2 Tanka of Gujarat Standard**, Akbar named as Sultan Akbar Badshah, frozen AH 911 year (G&G# G645). *After conquering Muzaffar Shah III, the last Sultan of Gujarat, Akbar imitated metrology of the Gujarat Sultans for a very brief period and issued these rare coins on that standard. Very Fine, Scarce.*



50 ~ 2,800-3,000
Akbar, Silver, **Rupee, Berar mint**, Allahu Akbar type, Ilahi 4x, Amardad month. Die-engraver's name, **Ram** inscribed under the mint name on rev. *Its interesting to note that quite before the East India Company or the British, who employed putting names of the die-engravers on their coins, the Mughals had already started the same practice of inscribing names of the die-engravers on the coin itself. On the present coin, name in Persian reads Ram which is very prominent and not easy to miss. Such a practice was permitted by the Mughal Badshahs otherwise this could never have happen. About Extremely Fine, Rare.*



51 ~ 3,000-3,500
Akbar, Silver, **Rupee, Berar mint**, Allahu Akbar type, Ilahi 4x, Ardibihisht Month. A small Trishul on the left of the mint name on rev. *It was believed by many scholars that all the coins of Berar mint could not have been of Berar but probably of Bairata mint. This was due to the fact that all the known Berar coins, see the previous lot, never-ever have the full mint name, and only bera is visible. But the present coin conclusively proves that all these coins are indeed of Berar as it has the complete mint name, berar, on a broad flan. Very Fine+, Rare.*



52 ~ 2,000-2,500
Akbar, Silver, **Rupee, Burhanpur mint**, Allahu Akbar type, Ilahi 48, Di Month, mint name at bottom on rev (KM# 93.7). *Broad flan, decorated fields, Extremely Fine, Rare in this grade.*



53 ~ 2,600-3,000
Jahangir, Silver, 11.42 g, **Rupee, Jalnapur mint**, Kalima type with the mint name on obv in two lines, *nur ud din* couplet on rev, floral background behind the Persian legend make the coin attractive (KM# 168.4). *Very Fine+, Scarce.*



54 ~ 2,200-2,300

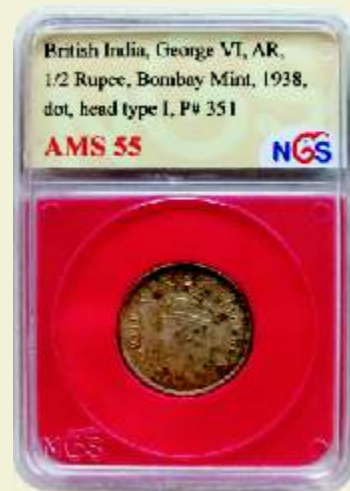

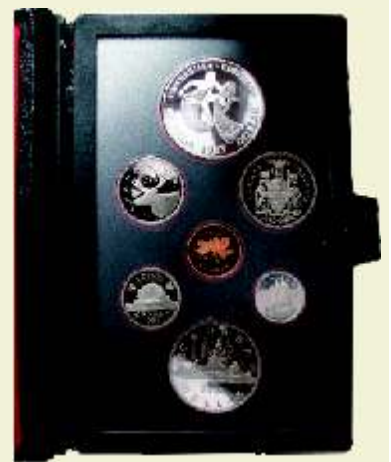

This is an Unpublished and unlisted example of British India notes used in Pakistan and it was discovered recently from a Treasury Record. These notes were never meant to be circulated again in Pakistan and were supposed to be sent back to Reserve Bank of India for retirement and reimbursement of the reserve to the Government of Pakistan.

Initially, date of 30th June 1948 was agreed between the two governments after which no Indian banknotes held in currency chests of the bank in Pakistan were to be put in circulation. These notes were to be delivered to Reserve Bank of India by June 30th 1949. An agreement was reached between the two countries that from 1 October 1948, the Reserve Bank of India would cease to be the currency authority of Pakistan and also from that date Indian notes would cease to be legal tender in Pakistan. However, the Pakistan Currency Authority and treasuries might accept them for a period of three months, which was later extended to 6 months. The issue of reserve against these Indian notes in circulation in Pakistan and transfer of their reserve to Pakistan continued till early 1950s. Another problem which was faced by both the governments was that jute trade of India with East Pakistan resulted in a large flow of Indian banknotes issued after 31 March 1948 in East Pakistan that were also found in the retired notes being sent from Pakistan to the RBI for transfer of reserve which led to further complications. 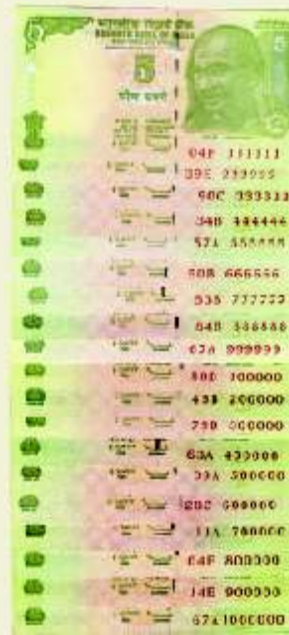

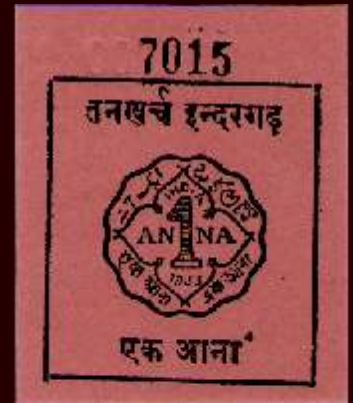
